

The United States of America is actually a very young nation compared to the other nations of the world. "what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God."

The words of the Prophet direct us to the way God expects us to live as citizens of this land and of the world. He says first of all:

"to do justice..."

This is a challenge to insure the rights of all and to interpret the truths of equality under God that we are all equal. He also says :

"to live kindness..."

A caring relationship for other persons: our family, our friends, the hurt and the hungry. Lastly, the Prophet commands us:

"to work humbly with your God."

This is a requirement which the pilgrim fathers knew well and which we must recognize anew in the midst of personal pride.

We need to fear the voice of God through the Prophet Micah and turn to Him, our God, before it is too late. The future of the U.S. may lie in the hands of future generations, but you, as you celebrate the birthday of our nation must renew your covenant, your agreement with God, individually, "to do justice, to love kindness and to work humbly with your God" for betterment of this nation. For as we are able to greet our tomorrow with a faith that is bigger and better than yesterday, we will continue to grow as a blessed nation, "under God".

Remember the people who walk with God shall know God. If thousands of Americans know God, then He will know us and our nation always. Put God back into these United States. God bless America, the Beautiful!

There are two seas in Palestine. One is fresh, and fish are in it. Splashes of green adorn its banks. Trees spread their branches over it and stretch out their thirsty roots to sip of its healing waters. Along its shores the children play, as children played when He was there. He loved it. He could look across its silver surface when He spoke His parables. And on a rolling plain not far away He fed five thousand people.

The River Jordan makes this sea with sparkling water from the hills. So it laughs in the sunshine. And men build their houses near to it, and birds their nests; and every kind of life is happier because it is there.

The River Jordan flows on south into another sea. Here is no splash of fish, no fluttering leaf, no song of birds, no children's laughter. Travelers choose another route, unless on urgent business. The air hangs heavy above its water, and neither man nor beast nor fowl will drink.

What makes this mighty difference in these neighbor seas? Not the river Jordan. It empties the same good water into both. Not the soil in which they lie not the country about.

This is the difference. The Sea of Galilee receives but does not keep the Jordan. For every drop that flows into it another drop flows out. The giving and receiving go on in equal measure.

The other sea is shrewder, hoarding its income jealously. It will not be tempted into any generous impulse. Every drop it gets, it keeps.

The Sea of Galilee gives and lives. This other sea gives nothing. It is named The Dead. There are **two kinds of people** in the world. There are two seas in Palestine.


