ATTENDANCE/CREDIT POLICY

Students taking high school courses are required to attend the entire eleven (11) day session. Students whose vacation and /or camp schedule interfere with the SLP/SMT should not enroll. A tardy over 5 minutes is considered an absence. There will be no exceptions to the attendance policy. Attendance violation will result in a non-refundable loss of credit.

CODE OF CONDUCT

The Rochester Community Schools Code of Conduct will be followed by SLP/SMT students, especially as it pertains to tobacco use, alcohol/drugs, closed campus, dress code, and cell phones. **FAILURE TO FOLLOW THE CODE OF CONDUCT that leads to suspension will result in a non-refundable loss of credit.**

LUNCH

There will be a 25 minute lunch break (CLOSED CAMPUS TO ALL) for those students who attend both the am and pm sessions. Students may bring lunch or buy lunch from the cafeteria. Students may not have lunch deliveries to the school.

REGISTRATION

All registration will be completed online beginning April 15, 2013. Computers will be available for walk-in registration on June 17-19 from 8:00 AM—3:00 PM at Van Hoosen Middle School. If you do not have access to a computer or a debit/credit card you may register at the RCS Business Office located on the 3rd floor of the Administration Building at 501 W University.

REFUNDS

A 5% processing fee will be deducted from all refunds processed before the first day of school. There are no refunds after the first day of class.

BOOKS

All books must be returned at the end of SLP class. Credit will be withheld until books have been returned.

PAYMENT

Payments must be made during the registration process using a debit or credit card. If you do not have a debit or credit card, payment by check, money order, or cash may be brought to the RCS Business Office located on the 3rd floor of the Administration Building at 501 W. University.

INCOMING NINTH GRADERS ON-LINE LEARNING

On-line Learning System is a computer-based learning system that provides students with another medium for achieving academic credit. The On-line Learning System allows students to work at their own pace in completing necessary academic courses without sacrificing the rigor of a traditional classroom.

How does On-line Learning work?

- On-line courses require students to have remote access to a high speed internet, stand alone PC.
- The coursework will be accessible the first day of the session.
- All coursework, notebooks, and assessments must be completed by the last day of the session. If these are not completed, the student will not be allowed to take the final exam. There are no exceptions.
- Students will take their final exams at ACE High School on the last day of the session.
- If the course is not completed in the allotted number of days, the student will earn a failing grade. There will be no extensions or incompletes.
- Students will have access to their course portals five (5) hours a day during the session, either from 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (On-line A) or from 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. (On-line B). Access outside of the scheduled session times will be on a first come first serve basis.
- Each on-line course is designed to be the equivalent of approximately 60 hours of instruction.
- Students must spend a minimum of eight hours (8) a week on their on-line course, or they will be dropped from the course.
- The teacher will use RCS e-mail as the medium for communication with the students.
- **There will be a mandatory introductory meeting for all parents and students to review the course and technology requirements. The meeting will be held at 6:30 p.m. at ACE High School, 1440 John R. Road, Rochester Hills.**

 - Session II Mandatory Meeting Date: Monday, July 8, 2013 at 6:30 p.m.
 - Session III Mandatory Meeting Date: Thursday, July 25, 2013 at 6:30 p.m.

Objectives:

- Students will be required to take notes to assist in their learning the course content. Notebooks are considered a vital part of the on-line learning course.
- Students' grades will be based on completing on-line assessments, an on-line final exam, their notebooks, and any assigned supplemental materials.
