

Law Enforcement Response to WMD Train the Trainer A State Offering

Dates of Course:	June 23 – 24, 2004

<u>Course Location:</u> Charlotte Fire and Police Academy. <u>Class will be held on the Law Enforcement</u> <u>side</u>. From the hotel, take Nations Ford Road to Tyvola, turn right and go to Tryon Street / Highway 49. Turn left and travel approximately 1 mile to Shopton Road. Turn right and the Police and Fire Academy will be on your right.

Time:Class will begin at 8:30 a.m. on Wednesday, June 23 and end by 5:00 Thursday, June 24.

- **Course Outline:** The purpose of this course is prepare trainers/students to understand and recognize terrorism, defensive considerations (chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive), and control issues associated with WMD activity. Applicable standards and regulations outlining the core competencies at the Operations Level for emergency responders will be used in modifying and delivering this course. Trainers will be taught training methodologies to teach their law enforcement officers in such areas as: recognition of a WMD incident, implementing self-protection measures, securing the scene, notifying appropriate local, State, and/or Federal authorities, and the transition phases from an emergency incident to a recovery incident.
- Registration
 If you are interested in attending the above course, please complete the attached application and forward it to the State Office as soon as possible. The deadline for receiving applications in the State Office is June 9, 2004. All non-EM personnel must submit their application through their county emergency management office.
- HotelHotel accommodations have been arranged at Wingate Hotel, 6057 Nations Ford Road,
Charlotte. Room rates will be \$49.00 plus tax per night. The telephone number for
making reservations is (704) 523-3366. Please identify yourself with "NC Emergency
Management" to ensure receiving this rate. Reservations should be made by June 9,
2004.
- **Reimbursement:** We will reimburse students for hotel expenses not to exceed the rates listed above for a maximum of one night. Students whose workstations are at least 200 miles from the course location may be reimbursed for two nights if the class ends after 2:00 p.m. on the last day. Those students whose workstations are 35 miles or less from the course location will not be reimbursed lodging expenses. In addition, we will be reimbursing students for meals at the State per diem rate (\$6.75 for breakfast, \$8.75 for lunch, and \$15.00 for dinner). We will not reimburse mileage for either those students staying at the hotel or those who commute to / from class each day.
