#### Abstract

The University of Pennsylvania men's basketball team struggled through its first Ivy League weekend at Dartmouth and Harvard, getting swept on that Northern New England trip for the first time since the 1987-88 season. The Quakers return to The Palestra this weekend hoping to reverse fortunes, as Cornell is here Friday and Columbia arrives on Saturday.


## The Penn-Cornell Series

- The Quakers and the Big Red have met 218 times, with Penn holding a 144-74 lead in the series.
- Penn has won three of the last four meetings, after dropping seven of eight to the Big Red from 2008-11.
- Penn and Cornell split last season's series, each team winning on the road. The Big Red won for the fourth time in its last six trips to The Palestra, 71-69-Patrick Lucas-Perry led Penn with 14 points-but the Red and Blue returned the favor in Ithaca, 79-71, behind 29 points from Tony Hicks.


## The C-C Home Weekend

- Penn has hosted Cornell and Columbia on the same weekend 54 times; the Quakers have swept the weekend 40 times, split it 12 times, and been swept twice (in 1968 and 2009).
- Penn has split this home weekend three of the last four years; last season, the Quakers opened with a win on Friday over Columbia (62-58) but then fell to Cornell on Saturday (71-69).
- Penn swept this weekend two years ago, beating Cornell on Friday and Columbia on Saturday.

## Weekly Honors

- Senior forward Fran Dougherty was named Ivy League Player of the Week on January 13.
- Sophomore guard Tony Hicks was co-Ivy League Player of the Week on November 11, sharing the honor with Yale's Justin Sears.


## Early Start

Penn's season-opening, 78-73 loss to Temple not only marked the earliest Philadelphia Big 5 game since the start of the Big 5 in the 1950s; it also matched the earliest start, by date, in Penn program history. The other times the Quakers played on Nov. 9 was in 2007, when they lost to Drexel in overtime at The Palestra, 67-59; and last year, when they overcame a 22-point deficit to defeat UMBC, 80-75.

## Home is Where the Wins Are

Penn entered the 2013-14 season with 803 wins at The Palestra, which opened in 1927. In an informal survey of the other NCAA Division I programs, only Washington (932 wins at Hec Edmundson Pavilion) and Butler (826 wins at Hinkle Fieldhouse) boasted more wins in their current home than the Quakers. The Edmundson Pavilion was opened in 1927, while the Bulldogs opened Hinkle in 1928.

## Across The Pond

Penn spent nine days in Italy during the month of August. The Quakers spent two nights each in Venice and Florence, then spent the rest of the trip in Rome. Penn played three games while in Italy, winning all of them easily. The trip represented a homecoming of sorts for Head Coach Jerome Allen, who spent a majority of his pro playing career in Italy.

## Up The Scoring Chart

Senior Miles Jackson-Cartwright has 1,277 points for his career which is 17 th in Penn history; he passed Perry Bromwell (1,265 from 1985-87) last night at Dartmouth. Joe Sturgis ( 1,292 points from 1954-56) is 17th. Check page 16 of these notes to see where JacksonCartwright fits on other career lists at Penn.

The Quaker Notemeal of Note

- Penn played a game on every Saturday in January this season. Seems reasonable, right? It is, until you realize that the Quakers haven't done that since the 2002-03 season.
- Penn has held 13 of its 17 opponents this season below 45 percent shooting from the field; George Mason was one of those other four teams, but barely-the Patriots shot 45.3 percent (24-53) on January 2.
- Penn is 4-4 this season when leading at the half; before last Friday's game at Dartmouth, when the Quakers surrendered a seven-point halftime advantage and lost to the Big Green, the halftime leads they had lost were 1 point (Lafayette), 1 point (Wagner), and 2 points (George Mason).
- Penn entered the week sixth nationally in assist/field goal ratio, at .650; that is behind only Denver (.684), Utah State (.682), Creighton (.655), UC Santa Barbara (.651) and American (.651).
- In Penn's 17 games so far, head coach Jerome Allen has played 15 players in a game twice this season, 14 players four times, and 13 players six times; last weekend, all 13 players who dressed saw time in both games.
- Nine different players have made at least two starts for Penn this season, and only senior Fran Dougherty has started all 17 games.
- Penn has used eight different starting lineups in its 17 games this season-five of them in the last 11 games-and has put out the same lineup in consecutive games just seven times.
- Penn has four players averaging double figures in scoring-Tony Hicks (14.8), Miles Jackson-Cartwright (11.8), Dougherty (11.7), Darien Nelson-Henry (11.5)—but the Quakers have had more than three doublefigure scorers in a game just once this season (January 25 against NJIT).
- Through the first 17 games, five different players have led Penn in scoring (Dougherty, Jackson-Cartwright, Hicks, Nelson-
Henry, Julian Harrell) and all five have had at least one 20 -point game.
- After recording 14 rebounds combined in Penn's first four games ( 3.5 rpg ), Dougherty has 105 in the last 13 contests ( 8.1 rpg ); he has snared nine or more boards in nine of Penn's last 12 games.
- Hicks has led Penn or shared the lead in scoring in six of the Quakers' last seven games ( 18.8 ppg in that stretch); the outlier came last Friday at Dartmouth when he had four points.
- Jackson-Cartwright has hit six threepointers in one game this season (Rider), five treys in another game (Monmouth), and four in three other games (Villanova, George Mason, NJIT).
- Jackson-Cartwright enters the weekend having hit 19 of his last 21 free throws.
- Jackson-Cartwright has started 96 of the last 99 games he has played at Penn; earlier this season, he came off the bench at Marist due to a thumb injury. The other times he played in a game but did not start during this stretch? Dec. 10, 2011 at UCLA, and March 8, 2011 against Princeton (Penn's Senior Day of his freshman year).


## Notemeal From Ivy Weekend 1 (at Dartmouth/Harvard)

- Dartmouth's 21 first-half points were an opponent low for this season.
- Senior Steve Rennard tied season/career highs in assists (3) and three-point baskets (3) at Dartmouth; he had all of the Quakers' treys in that game.
- Junior Henry Brooks set a season high and tied a career best with three steals at Harvard.

## Notemeal From NJIT

- Penn scored 89 points, the most in the Jerome Allen era and the most since a 97-94 2OT loss to Delaware on Nov. 21, 2009.
- Penn also set Allen-era highs in first-half points (47), free throws made (35), free throws attempted (42), and rebounds (46).
- For the second time in three games, Penn had a season-high +17 margin on its opponent in the rebound category.
- Penn had four players score in double figure for the first time this season.
- For the first time this season, Penn led a game wire-to-wire.
- Senior Miles Jackson-Cartwright set a career high with four steals; he had all of the Quakers' thefts in the game.
- Senior Fran Dougherty (10 points, 10 rebounds) and sophomore Darien NelsonHenry (10 points, 11 rebounds) both had double-doubles; the last time Penn had two players with double-doubles in the same game was Feb. 20, 2010 (Dan Monckton and Jack Eggleston against Yale).
- All of Nelson-Henry's points came at the foul line, where he was 10 -of- 14 , and his 11 rebounds tied a season/career high.
- Junior Henry Brooks had nine points, a season high.


## Notemeal From Saint Joseph's

- Penn tied a season high in assists (22) and tied a low in turnovers (10).
- Penn got 31 points from the bench and 16 from the freshman class, both season highs.
- Senior Steve Rennard tied a career high with 13 points, his first double-figure scoring game this season, and also tied a career best with three 3-point FG.
- Freshman Dylan Jones had 10 points for his first double-figure scoring game at Penn; he also set season/career highs in rebounds (5) and minutes (15).
- Freshman Matt Howard tied season/career highs in points (6) and rebounds (3) and set a season/career best in assists (2).


## Notemeal From Princeton

- Penn improved to 14-13 in games decided by three or fewer points in the Jerome Allen coaching era (3-4 in one-point games; 6-6 in two-point games; 5-3 in three-point games).
- For the first time in five games and the fifth time this season, Penn outrebounded its opponent (42-25); the Quakers' +17 differential was a season best, and Princeton's 25 boards were an opponent low for this season.
- For the first time in 10 games, and just the third time this season, Penn attempted more free throws (26) than its opponent (24).
- Penn tied a team low with three three-point baskets in the game, and set a season low with nine attempts from beyond the arc.
- Dougherty collected his second doubledouble this season and the sixth of his career ( 17 points, 12 rebounds); his 12 rebounds were a season high and one shy of his career high.
- Playing for the first time in five games, Nelson-Henry scored Penn's first five points and ended the day with 17 .
- Playing for the first time in three games, sophomore Julian Harrell tied his season/ career high with two blocked shots.


## Notemeal From La Salle

- For just the second time in the last nine games, Penn had fewer turnovers (15) than its opponent (18).
- Dougherty tied a career best with three blocked shots.

Notemeal From George Mason

- This was the first meeting between these programs in men's basketball.
- Penn had 10 steals, just the second time this season the Quakers have reached double figures in that category (also 13 at Monmouth).
- Penn hit nine three-point baskets, giving the Quakers 19 in the last two games; they were averaging 5.4 treys per game prior to this week.
- Sophomore Tony Hicks led Penn with 23 points; in the previous four games, HicksPenn's leading scorer this season—had scored 24 points combined.
- Hicks also set a career high with six assists and tied a season high with four three-point baskets.


## Notemeal From Rider

- Penn scored 52 points in the second half, tying its best second half in the Allen era (also Dec. 22, 2010 at Delaware).
- Penn shot 59.6 from the field, its best performance since last year against Lafayette; amazingly, in that game last year the Quakers also shot 59.6 percent ( 31 of 52 , as happened on Sunday), and they lost the game (86-83).
- Sophomore Julian Harrell's point total not only was a career high, it nearly matched his total for the entire season prior to the game (31).
- Jackson-Cartwright also tied a career high with nine assists (done twice before, most recently Feb. 22, 2013 at Cornell).
- Jackson-Cartwright led Penn with six rebounds, a season high, becoming just the third different player to lead the team in that category in a game this season.
- All of Jackson-Cartwright's field goals were three-pointers, a career-high six, the most by a Penn player since Tyler Bernardini hit eight vs. Marist on Dec. 23, 2011.
- Dougherty scored 16 of his 18 points in the second half. He figured in all of Penn's first 14 points of the second half, scoring nine of them and assisting on the other five.
- Senior Cameron Gunter set season highs in points (8), rebounds (5) and minutes (19).
- Sophomore Jamal Lewis set a season high in points (7).
- Junior Greg Louis set a career high with three blocked shots.



## Notemeal From Marist

- Penn got 30 points from its bench, a season high.
- Penn had no players reach double figures in the scoring column, a first in the Allen era.
- Brooks set a career high with three assists.


## Notemeal From Wagner

- This marked Penn's first overtime game of 2013-14, and the second straight year the Quakers and Seahawks needed OT to settle matters.
- Penn set season highs in three-pointers (8) and rebounds (44).
- Dougherty had his first double-double of the season (fifth career) with 17 points and a season-high 11 rebounds.
- Rennard tied a career high with three assists.


## Notemeal From Villanova

- The game featured an 11-0 run by Villanova to start the contest, a 12-0 run by Penn later in the first half, and a 12-0 run by the Wildcats late in the second half.
- Penn held Villanova without a point for the first 7:31 of the second half, and without a field goal for the first 10:55 of the period.
- Jackson-Cartwright scored 14 of his teamhigh 17 points in the first half; all four of his treys came in a span of $4: 10$ and provided 12 of the points in a 15-4 run.
- Nelson-Henry scored 12 points, matching his total from the previous two games combined (4 vs. Niagara, 8 at Lafayette).
- Bagtas made his first collegiate start, and after playing just 19 minutes in Penn's first six games-and just five in the previous three games combined-he played 36 in this one.

## Notemeal From Lafayette

## Notemeal From Penn State

- Nelson-Henry scored 21 points, a career high, and went 11-of-11 at the foul line, the best performance by a Penn player at the charity stripe since Zack Rosen went 12-of-12 against Delaware on Dec. 7, 2011.


## Notemeal From Monmouth

- Penn had 13 steals, a high in the Allen era.
- Nelson-Henry had his second-straight double-double (fourth of his career) with 14 points and 11 rebounds (tying a career high).
- Hicks set new career highs with eight rebounds and four steals.
- Harrell made his collegiate debut and had two points, five rebounds and three assists in 17 minutes. His only points broke a 59-59 tie, and Penn never trailed again in the game. (Harrell missed all of last year due to injury.)


## Notemeal From Temple

- Hicks led all scorers with 28 points, one shy of his career high and the most by a Penn player in a season opener since the 2001-02 season (Ugonna Onyekwe 30 at Georgia Tech).
- Hicks took 24 shots, tying the high by a Penn player in the Jerome Allen coaching era (Zack Rosen took 24 against Princeton on March 6, 2012), and made 12 which was one shy of a player high in the Allen era.
- Hicks scored eight straight points late in the game to push Penn from a 71-65 deficit to a 73-71 lead (the Quakers' first lead in the game since 9-8).
- Nelson-Henry scored a career-high 19 points and had 10 rebounds-one shy of a career best-for his third collegiate doubledouble. Thirteen of his points and seven of his boards came in the second half.
- Freshmen Jones, Howard and Bagtas saw their first collegiate action. Jones' first collegiate basket came on a dunk.

## Preseason Notemeal

- Penn boasts two players who received all-conference recognition last year, senior Miles Jackson-Cartwright (second-team All-Ivy) and sophomore Tony Hicks (All-Ivy honorable mention). Jackson-Cartwright led Penn in scoring with 13.5 points per game last season, while Hicks was second with 10.4 ppg . Jackson-Cartwright also led Penn with 113 assists and was second with 31 steals and 35 three-point baskets.
- Hicks boasts a unique status in the long, illustrious history of University of Pennsylvania basketball. As a high school senior in Chicago, he earned a spot on the prestigious Parade All-America Team, one of 40 players nationwide to be so recognized. When he came to Penn, he became the first Parade All-America to suit up for the Quakers.
- Another player who likely would have earned All-Ivy honors last year was senior forward Fran Dougherty, if he hadn't gotten hurt at midseason. Dougherty led Penn in scoring and rebounding through the first 10 games, missed several games due to mononucleosis, then came back for two games but suffered a season-ending injury during the second one. He averaged 13.8 points and 8.1 rebounds.
- Like Hicks, sophomore center Darien Nelson-Henry was another player who enjoyed a strong rookie campaign last year, averaging 7.6 points and 4.1 rebounds per game. However, he scored in double figures 10 times in his last 17 appearances, and had double-doubles against NJIT (12 points, 11 rebounds) and Ivy League champion Harvard (18 points, 11 rebounds). Nelson-Henry also led Penn with 25 blocked shots and a . 540 field-goal percentage.
- Junior forward Henry Brooks, Jr. started 28 games last year and played in 30 of the Quakers' 31 contests. (Only JacksonCartwright started more, at 30.) Brooks averaged 6.5 points and 3.4 rebounds per game, scoring in double figures six times and ending the season with a nine-point, 11-rebound performance against Penn's archrival, Princeton.
- Only one player saw time in every game for Penn last season, junior forward Greg Louis (after he did not play as a freshman due to injury). Louis averaged 3.9 points and 3.2 rebounds per game last year, highlighted by a double-double at Delaware (19 points, 11 rebounds).
- Penn's top three-point threat last year was junior guard Patrick Lucas-Perry; 38 of his 49 field goals came from beyond the arc, and he led the Quakers in that category. "PLP" had
a trio of 15-point games-against UMBC, at Temple and at Brown-as well as 14 against Ivy League foe Cornell.
- Senior guard Steve Rennard has struggled to stay healthy the last few years; last season, he started 18 of the first 19 games before suffering a season-ending injury. He averaged 4.2 points and 1.9 rebounds per game.
- Another guard, sophomore Jamal Lewis, started 19 games and made 28 appearances overall. He averaged 3.5 points and 2.0 rebounds per game-highlighted by a 16-point game at Wagner and a 14-point effort at Dartmouth—and led Penn with 38 steals while finishing second with 67 assists.
- One of the most inspirational players on Penn's team is senior Dau Jok. A native of the Sudan, his family escaped to the United States after the death of his father. After an extremely limited role in Penn's lineup his first two seasons, Jok played in 29 of the Quakers' 31 games last year.
- Junior guard Camryn Crocker started eight games last year and played in 27, averaging 2.2 points and 1.6 rebounds. He also had one of the best assist/turnover ratios in the Ivy League (62 assists/45 turnovers).
- Senior center Cameron Gunter had a limited role for the first half of last season, scoring just 10 points total in Penn's first 22 games; he then dropped 10 and added nine rebounds in the Quakers' 23rd game, at Ivy League champion Harvard, and scored a combined 18 in the last eight contests.
- A player who did not see any time last year due to injury but is on the trip is sophomore swingman Julian Harrell; he hopes to be a factor at the guard/forward spot.


## Meet The Newcomers

- Tony Bagtas (Union City, Ga.) was a twotime first-team all-state and a two-time Player of the Year in South Atlanta, South Fulton and in his region. He also was Class 5A South Player of the Year as a junior at Westlake HS.
- Matt Howard (Columbia, S.C.) was a twotime all-state selection and regional Player of the Year as a senior, when he led A.C. Flora to a 22-7 record and a regional title.
- Dylan Jones (Houston, Texas) was captain of his Village School team as a senior, and a three-time recipient of the team's Best Defensive Award.
- Preston Troutt (Dallas, Texas) was a fouryear letterwinner at Trinity Christian.


## Jerome Allen W'09, John R. Rockwell Head Coach

## Penn Coaching Career

- Returned to Penn as a volunteer assistant for the 2009-10 season but promoted to the interim head coach position on Dec. 14, 2009.
- Formally named the John R. Rockwell Head Coach of Men's Basketball on March 30, 2010, after going 6-15 as interim coach.
- Penn improved from 6-22 his interim season —he was 6-15 as interim coach—to 13-15 his first full season, then 20-13 last year.
- In Ivy League play, Penn went 5-9 in Allen's interim year-he was head coach for every Ivy game that season-then improved to 7-7 in 2010-11 and improved upon that to go 11-3 and finish second in 2011-12, a game behind Harvard in the standings. (Penn went into its final game at Princeton with a chance to gain a share of the title, but fell to the Tigers 62-52.)


## Penn Playing Career

- A four-year starter from 1992-95, led the Quakers to Ivy League titles each of his last three seasons, all of them coming via a perfect 14-0 mark. (Penn also won its last Ivy game his freshman year, in 1991-92, as well as its first five Ivy League games in 1995-96, giving the Quakers a 48-game Ivy winning streak that remains the conference record.)
- Ivy League Player of the Year in 1992-93 as a sophomore-sharing the honor with Columbia's Buck Jenkins-and again as a junior in 1993-94, making him one of three Penn players to earn the honor twice.
- Three-time first-team All-Ivy and AllPhiladelphia Big 5 selection.
- Ended his career as the program's all-time leader in assists (504) and steals (166). Scored 1,488 career points, which is currently ninth on Penn's all-time scoring list, and grabbed 482 career rebounds from his guard position.
- Inducted into the Philadelphia Big 5 Hall of Fame in February 2009.


## Why is He Listed as Penn '09?

Jerome Allen left Penn following the 1994-95 basketball season to pursue his professional basketball career, attending NBA draft camps and such. At the time, he was two classes shy of his degree from Penn's Wharton School of Business. Upon the conclusion of his playing career in Europe, Allen returned to coach with the Quakers and also took those final two classes to complete his degree.

- Penn's 1992-93 squad went 22-5 overall, wresting the Ivy crown away from Princeton after the Tigers' four-year run before losing in the NCAA first round to
 Massachusetts.
- In 1993-94, Penn went 25-3 overall and earned an NCAA first-round victory over Nebraska before losing to Florida in the second round.
- Captain of the 1994-95 team that went 22-6 and again advanced to the NCAAs, losing to Alabama in overtime in the first round.


## Pro Playing Career

- Second-round draft pick of the NBA's Minnesota Timberwolves and spent two seasons in the NBA with Minnesota, Indiana and Denver.
- He then enjoyed a stellar professional career in Europe-primarily Italy—before retiring at the end of the 2008-09 season.


## Coaching Background

- In the summer of 2007, did an internship with the San Antonio Spurs, serving as an assistant coach on their summer league team at the Las Vegas NBA Summer League and the Rocky Mountain Review in Salt Lake City, Utah. As part of that program, he participated in both practice instructing and game scout.
- In February 2009, awarded the head coaching position for Snaidero Basket of Italy's Serie A, with whom he had previously played for four seasons. With that, he became the first person in 15 years to be promoted to head coach while still actively playing in one of the top European leagues (Italy, Spain, Greece, Russia, France, Turkey).


## Philanthropy

- Founded Brothers Embracing Brothers (BEB) in 1997. In an attempt to convey the message of neighborhood involvement, BEB established a men's basketball league. Over the years BEB evolved and began working with the neighborhood youth. With a new mission in place, Hood Enriched was formed with the objective to cultivate the academic and athletic attributes of inner-city youth.
- Using the motto "expect to be exceptional," students were exposed to educational analysis exams and monitored thereafter. In addition, a summer job program allowed participants to develop proper workplace behavior.

However, Hicks drained a trey, and then after a Pepper miss Hicks again dialed long distance to tie the game at 71-71 with 1:52 left. Hicks then stole the ball and laid it in to give Penn its first lead since 9-8 early in the game.

Lee again scored on a layup to tie the game, and then as the game went inside a minute JacksonCartwright tried to get into the lane. He lost the ball on the dribble, however, and it ended up in Lee's hands. He fed Pepper ahead of the pack and Pepper laid it in to make the score 75-73.

Hicks missed a three, and had to foul Will Cummings on the rebound. Cummings only hit one shot, keeping it a one-possession game, but with seven seconds left Hicks again missed from longrange. Pepper got the board, was fouled, and hit the free throws to set the final score.

In a game that was never separated by more than six points in the final 13 minutes, there was just one lead change in the second half. That occurred when Lafayette's Seth Hinrichs drained a three-pointer to punctuate an 11-0 run that turned a nine-point Quakers lead into a 58-56 Leopards advantage.

With the score 71-70, Lafayette had two killer possessions in a row. With the shot clock winding down on the first one, an errant pass out top landed in Joey Ptasinski's hands and he knocked down a three as the shot clock hit one second. Following a Henry Brooks miss for Penn, Lafayette again worked the clock down and this time Alan Flannigan drained a dagger shot from just inside the line on the right baseline. That made the score $76-70$ with 1:29 to play.

Penn got within a possession on two occasions after that, the first at 76-73 (Jamal Lewis hoop and foul) and again at 78-76 (Fran Dougherty trey).

- Penn lost for the first time this season when leading at the half (previously 2-0 in such games).
- Senior Fran Dougherty had 26 points and nine rebounds, finishing one board shy of his fifth collegiate double-double.
