A COST-BENEFIT OPTIMIZATION APPROACH TO AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT



Dr. Paolo Zannetti, QEP, The EnviroComp Institute

Dr. Paolo Zannetti is the President and Founder of EnviroComp Consulting, Inc. (<u>www.envirocomp.com</u>) and the non-profit EnviroComp Institute (<u>www.envirocomp.org</u>). He has performed studies and scientific research in environmental sciences for more than 40 years throughout the world. His activities have covered pure research in the fields of atmospheric diffusion and numerical computation, written publications, seminars and courses, project management, environmental consulting, editorial productions, and expert testimony. His major field of investigation and competence is air pollution. He has written more than 300 publications, including the first comprehensive textbook on Air Pollution Modeling, which was published in 1990. He recently produced a multi-volume, multi-author, revised and expanded edition of this book (<u>www.envirocomp.org/aqm</u>).

WHAT IS HAPPENING IN HAMILTON?

A panel of speakers focussing on the experience of Hamilton with complete streets and other transportation initiatives

Hamilton has begun to explore Complete Streets – streets designed for all road users including pedestrians, cyclists, transit users and auto-drivers. Transportation emissions have a large impact on local air quality and Complete Streets designs can have a significant positive impact. This concurrent session will present successful case examples on how to develop Complete Streets in Hamilton from Policy to Implementation.

Norma Moores - A Senior Transportation Engineer at IBI Group. Ms. Moores was involved in the Transportation Association of Canada's original Bikeway Traffic Control Guidelines for Canada (1998). Ms. Moores is currently leading TAC's project on a Synthesis of Practices for Active Transportation in Canada.

She recently completed the Cape Breton Regional Municipality Active Transportation Plan, Cambridge Bikeway Network Plan and contributed to Ottawa's Pedestrian Plan. Ms. Moores is on the Board of Directors for the Association of Pedestrian and Bicycle Professionals (APBP) and a fellow of the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE).

Peter Topalovic - City of Hamilton - Peter is Project Manager – Transportation Demand Management and the Program Manager of Smart Commute Hamilton and currently works in the Mobility Programs and Special Projects section of the City of Hamilton. He works with regional partners to operate the Smart Commute program and is the chair of the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area TDM Coordinating Committee. Peter is also involved with Open Streets Hamilton as a founding partner. He oversees the implementation of a wide range of programs, policy implementation and infrastructure projects to promote active and sustainable modes of transportation, bike sharing, carsharing and carpooling.

Steve Molloy - City of Hamilton - Steve is Project Manager - Transportation Management Plan Implementation. Steve worked on The Step Forward: Hamilton's Pedestrian Mobility Master Plan which won a 2013 Excellence in Planning Award from the Ontario Professional Planning Institute for Healthy Communities. "Step Forward establishes a 20-year framework to improve the pedestrian environment. The Plan achieves this goal by embedding a decision process, "routine accommodation" into municipal capitol and infrastructure renewal projects. Steve has over 10 years of experience as a transportation planner, previously to joining the City of Hamilton he worked on planning projects with iTRANS Consulting and MMM Group.

Sara Mayo - Sara is a Social Planner with a concentration in Geographic Information Systems. She specializes in making data accessible and useful for social change, especially through visualization and mapping. Sara contributes to many partnership tables and collaboratives. She is a member of the Hamilton Community Foundation's Vital Signs Advisory Committee and the City of Hamilton's Neighbourhood Development Evaluation committee. Beyond Hamilton, Sara was chair of the capacity building working group for the Canadian Council on Social Development's Community Data Consortium in 2011. This body assists municipalities and community organizations in over 20 communities across Canada to access neighbourhood-level social and economic data from a variety of sources. At both a professional and personal level, Sara is an advocate of public transit and cycling. She is a member of Hamilton CarShare co-operative and enjoys bike riding with her family.

Justin Jones - Justin lead the successful community Yes We Cannon campaign that petition City Council to improve cyclist and pedestrian safety in the lower city of Hamilton to create a bi-directional bike lane, running the full length of Cannon Street, by 2015. (<u>http://walkablehamilton.org/cannon</u>). Started in May 2013, the Yes We Cannon campaign had over 2,300 signatures and resulted in approval from Council for a pilot project in September 2013. Justin is a Program Manager with the Share the Road Cycling Coalition where he is developing and delivering the Ride and Drive with Care Program across Ontario. The Ride and



Drive with Care pledge is aimed at creating a healthy dialogue between cyclists and drivers from a young age. Justin is passionate about creating more sustainable, better connected communities through initiatives such as complete streets and the active transportation movement.

Integrating Climate Change Adaptation into Ajax's Official Plan Stev Andis MCIP, RPP, Senior Policy Planner, Town of Ajax

Stev Andis is a Senior Policy Planner with the Town of Ajax, Ontario. Her responsibilities include researching and analyzing environmental/sustainability policy developed by Provincial, Regional and municipal governments; nongovernmental organizations; and academia. Stev develops discussion papers, research reports, official plan policies, zoning provisions, and makes recommendations to Council to provide direction on various matters including climate change, renewable energy, water quality, air quality and natural heritage. Prior to working with the Town of Ajax, Stev was a Community Planner with the Ontario Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing.



Integrating sustainability metrics into the municipal planning process

Tony I acobelli, MSc, MCIP, RPP, Senior Environmental Planner, City of Vaughn

Tony Iacobelli is Senior Planner (Environment) at the City of Vaughan starting in 2008. Tony's current projects at the City include the Natural Heritage Network Study and developing sustainability performance metrics for use in the review of development applications, in collaboration with the City of Brampton and Town of Richmond Hill. Tony is on the Board of Directors of the Greater Toronto Area Chapter of the Canada Green Building Council and is currently on advisory teams for ICLEI Canada's *Urban Biodiversity Guidebook* and Ontario Nature's *Best Practices Guide to Natural Heritage System Planning in Ontario*.

Michelle Dobbie, BES, MLA, MCIP, RPP, City of Richmond Hill

Michelle Dobbie is Senior Planner (Policy) within the Planning and Regulatory Services Department at the Town of Richmond Hill. Her university background is in planning and landscape architecture. Since joining the Town of Richmond Hill, Michelle has been an integral part of the formulation and drafting of Richmond Hill's new Official Plan – *Building s New Kind of Urban*, which emphasizes sustainability and placemaking as key components of its vision. More recently, Michelle lead the preparation of the Town-wide Urban Design Guidelines and continues to lead the implementation and monitoring of the inter-municipal Sustainability Metrics developed with the City of Brampton and the City of Vaughan.

Community Climate Adaptation Planning – Durham Region's Emergent Approach

Brian Kelly, Durham, Region

Brian Kelly is currently the Manager of Sustainability for the Region of Durham, where he was previously the Interim Advisor for Climate Change. Brian serves as staff support to the Durham Region Roundtable on Climate Change and manages Durham's community climate programs. Prior to this role with Durham Region, he was the founding Director of the Sustainable Enterprise Academy, YorkUniversity, an executive education program based at the Schulich School of Business, where he also taught Business Strategies for Sustainability in the MBA program.






