#### Get Ready for Palatine Celtic Cup 2003

Plans are well underway for our Club's showcase event in the travel soccer community during the Labor Day Weekend, Friday, August 29 – Monday, September 1. The games will be held at Palatine High School, Celtic Park, Hamilton Reservoir, Oak Park, Maple Park and Community Park, all in Palatine and within a few miles of each other. Over 320 local and out-of-state teams, including many Midwest State Cup Champions and Runner ups, are expected to participate this year.

With the help of numerous corporate sponsors, local businesses, organizers, and volunteers, this year's tournament should be one of the best in the Midwest, contributing great success to our dub and our community. In addition to the revenue contribution to the businesses of Palatine, last year the event raised over \$30,000 for the Club, part of which was used to pay our portion of the new restroom, concession, and storage facility at Hamilton. All funds raised from these tournaments are used to support the Club's capital program, which includes, among other things, a building at Celtic Park and lights on Hamilton fields. Annually, the event also provides an opportunity for travel teams to earn funds which offset their team's budget for uniforms, tournaments and trainer fees through their volunteer commitments and ad sales.

#### IYSA Selects Matt Jakobsze for ODP

Illinois Youth Soccer selected **Matthew Jakobsze** in the U-17 Boys Illinois Olympic Development Program State Team or more commonly known as Illinois ODP. Matthew is one of the youth players selected who are considered the "cream of the crop" in Illinois after an extensive four-day selection camp. Over 1,500 of the top youth soccer players in Illinois began the Illinois ODP process at district tryouts last July and during the course of the last year numerous training sessions and games have taken place to identify the top players in each age divi-

sion to advance to the Illinois ODP State Camp. The four-day "State Camp" was held at Northem Illinois University in DeKalb, Illinois.

Afterward, at the ODP-Region 2 Tournament, also at NIU, Matt captained the ODP-Region 2 Composite Team vs. Illinois, South Dakota and Northern Ohio.

Matthew Jakobsze, a former House and U-10 Travel player, has served for several years as a referee for Palatine Celtic Soccer and is now serving as an assistant coach to one of our travel teams.

Meet John McArtor - John, 29, a Palatine resident, is currently the Head Coach/ Trainer for the new Bovs U-9 Arsenal and Gunners teams. He has been playing soccer since he was 8 years old. John made the Milwaukee All-City High School 1st Team in '81 & '82; Wisconsin All-State 1st Team in '82. He played college dub soccer at University of Texas-El Paso. He currently plays for Palatine Celtic Over 30 and Glenview Park District (Open) teams. John's coaching experience includes 6 yrs. at the "rec" level with Palatine Celtic and Leduc (Alberta, Canada) and, most recently, 2 yrs. with U9 & U12 Girls and both last year's U9 Boys teams. He holds a USSF "D" Coaching License and will be going for NSCAA National Youth Diploma

John's view on coaching soccer includes lots of positive reinforcement (especially at the younger ages) and coaching primarily during practices and only at beginning, halftime, and end of games. During games, John lets players learn to make decisions for themselves and learn from their mistakes. At the younger ages, John focuses on ball mastery and tries to teach players to begin a love for the game, traditions and sportsmanship.

John is father to Raisa (Race), 13, Gabriella (Gabbi), 10, and John (Johnny), 7, who (as you may have already guessed!) all play soccer. ◆
