**Important:** Not all books have an editor, an author, or even list an edition statement. If this information is not available, move on to the next chunk of information. This example does not list an author, so it begins with the title of the article.

### Important:

1. A multivolume reference set may have an author listed on the title page. If it does not have an author listed on the title page, check the beginning and the end of the article. It may or may not list an author there. If it does not, leave the AUTHOR line blank.
2. Editors correct and arrange material within a book. An editor may or may not be listed on the title page of the encyclopedia. If it does list the editor, write it on the EDITOR line – first name, last name, ed.  
For example: Samuel Smith, ed. If not editor is listed, leave the line blank.
3. List the number of volume you used on the VOL line.
