BALTIMORE CATECHISM

LESSON FIFTEENTH: On Confirmation

Q. 670. What is Confirmation?

A. Confirmation is a Sacrament through which we receive the Holy Ghost to make us strong and perfect Christians and soldiers of Jesus Christ.

Q. 671. When was Confirmation instituted?

A. The exact time at which Confirmation was instituted is not known. But as this Sacrament was administered by the Apostles and numbered with the other Sacraments instituted by Our Lord, it is certain that He instituted this Sacrament also and instructed His Apostles in its use, at some time before His ascension into heaven.

Q. 672. Why is Confirmation so called?

A. Confirmation is so called from its chief effect, which is to strengthen or render us more firm in whatever belongs to our faith and religious duties.

Q. 673. Why are we called soldiers of Jesus Christ?

A. We are called soldiers of Jesus Christ to indicate how we must resist the attacks of our spiritual enemies and secure our victory over them by following and obeying Our Lord.

Q. 674. May one add a new name to his own at Confirmation?

A. One may and should add a new name to his own at Confirmation, especially when the name of a saint has not been given in Baptism.

Q. 675. Who administers Confirmation?

A. The bishop is the ordinary minister of Confirmation.



"40 DAYS FOR LIFE" CAMPAIGN BEGINS

We have all been shocked to view the recent videos exposing the terrible truth about the sale of fetal body parts by Planned Parenthood. Abortion is big business and the industry preys on the fears of women in crisis pregnancies. Many who have not confronted this evil before now are being motivated to fight for their tiny brothers and sisters in Christ.

If you have been wondering what you can do to stand up for justice and human dignity, please join this Fall's 40 Days for Life Campaign. Beginning September 23 over 100,000 people in over 300 cities will be peacefully praying and fasting for an end to abortion. This campaign focuses on maintaining a peaceful presence at local abortion facilities.

Ideally there will be enough volunteers to have a presence 12 hours a day, 7 days a week at the local abortion facility. For us this is the Cherry Hill Women's Center, 502 North Kings Highway in Cherry Hill. Approximately 300 abortions are performed there each week (up until 24 weeks gestation). To those going in for abortions, we are often their last sign of hope. With God's grace, the 40 Days for Life campaign counts 10,331 lives saved since 2007.
