2008-2009 Ravalli County Quality Assurance Q and A

What is Livestock Quality Assurance?

Livestock Quality Assurance is an educational program for youth to learn how to take care of livestock animals. It will inform 4-H and FFA members of their responsibilities as food producers.

Is Livestock Quality Assurance required?

Livestock Quality Assurance is an educational program required by Montana State University Extension and Montana 4-H Center for 4-H/FFA members who plan to sell in the Ravalli County 4-H/FFA Livestock Sale. Livestock members must attend a training once every two years, however members can attend a training every year if they want.

How often do I need it?

The 4-H Livestock Committee voted in Fall 2008 to change the requirement for 4-H members to have Quality Assurance training to once every two years rather than every year. In order to sell at the Ravalli County 4-H/FFA Livestock Sale, members must have attended a QA training within the last two years. For example, if you went to a training during the 2007-2008 4-H year, you don't need to attend a training until 2009-2010 4-H year. Members are still welcome to attend a training every year but it is no longer required.

When are Livestock Quality trainings?

Members must attend an approved training. For the 2008-2009 4-H year, there will be several Quality Assurance trainings – some will be animal specific.




