"Dinner on the Ground"

Long before it was known as a church picnic, this day of worship and sharing was referred to as "Dinner on the Ground". The name "Dinner on the Ground" was coined when churches were much smaller and did not have fellowship halls that could hold everyone. "Dinner on the Ground" was held several times a month during the summer months. The church family came prepared with meats, desserts, and side-dishes. Families would spread a blanket on the ground and share their dishes with everyone. In some rural communities you might pull picnic tables together or even use a wagon to display all of the delicious items. One thing you could be sure of, this day was dedicated to worshipping and sharing in music, games and laughter as a church family. Today's church picnics may not last an entire day, but the heart of the event is still the same — togetherness, becoming one, a strong body that supports it's members. Please join your church family on July 10, in the park!



On Sunday, July 10th - 9:00 a.m. Worship will be held in the sanctuary, along with children's and adult Sunday School in their respective rooms.

10:30 a.m. Worship will be held at the Halifax Memorial Park followed by the church picnic. Please bring a family-sized covered dish and lawn chairs.

We again plan to offer baptisms at the church picnic. Please contact the church office by July 6 if you wish to participate in the baptisms. You may also sign-up that day, but your advance notice is appreciated.



Standing in the Gap for Your Children through Prayer

As a result of attending Parent Connect, then watching the movie War Room the Holy Spirit inspired me to make praying for my family a daily priority as they navigate their way through this crazy world and the public school system. As I sought to increase my ability to pray, I was introduced to a group of Moms who impact not only their families but their communities and ultimately the world by meeting regularly to pray. This group of Moms is known as Moms in Prayer International.

What is Moms in Prayer International? It's two or more women who meet regularly to intercede on behalf of children and schools through prayer. It's open to Christian mothers, grandmothers or any woman who is willing to pray for a specific child and school. Moms in Prayer's vision is that every school in the world would be covered with prayer.

A message on their website motivates me even more to pray...

"What if you could change the world – not just for today but for generations to come? At Moms in Prayer International, we believe that a mom can be the single greatest force for good in the lives of her children and the children around her. We believe that lives and whole communities are changed forever when moms gather together to pray to the only One who can change a human heart. Moms can make the difference as they reach out to God in prayer...."

To learn more about praying I joined a *Moms in Prayer* bible study entitled Igniting a Passion to Pray. In the study I learned that the *Moms in Prayer* time is divided into Four Steps of Prayer: Praise (for who God is), Silent Confession (silently confessing sin to the God who forgives), Thanksgiving (for what God has done) and Intercession (praying scripture and specific requests for children & school staff & *Moms in Prayer* International). The most meaningful concept that I learned was to use scripture when praying for others. As an intercessor prays back to God His very words on behalf of others Satan's attacks can be thwarted, we follow Jesus' own example, and God's word can teach us how to pray accurately. In addition, by using scripture to pray I am learning to walk consistently and lean on God's Word for guidance and direction in the life of my family. This experience has been changing me on the inside and stirring up a passion deep within me to memorize and soak in God's Word on a daily basis.

Unless the Lord directs otherwise, I am planning to lead a *Moms in Prayer* group for the Halifax Area School District this Fall during What's Up Wednesdays. I'd like to begin with the Igniting a Passion to Pray curriculum for the first six weeks or so.

The following are examples using scripture during prayer (just place the person's name in the blank):

A prayer for a teacher or school staff member: LORD, I pray You will watch over _____'s coming and going both now and forevermore. From Psalm 121:8 (NIV)

A prayer for your child: Help _____ to not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, may he/she present his/her requests to God. And may the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard his/her heart and your mind in Christ Jesus. From Philippians 4:6-7

I'd like to end with a quote that was borrowed from Patrick Henry's words he used when he urged his fellow Virginians to join the Revolution of 1775, "Our brethren [and sisters] are already in the field! Why stand we here idle?" Sisters in Christ let's experience firsthand what happens when moms stand in the gap for their children and watch the world around us change in a positive way through prayer. Ready, set PRAY!

I am really blessed this summer to have the chance to serve with Isaiah 61 ministries for a few hours each week through an internship that is part of my degree program at Asbury Theological Seminary. It's an awesome thing sometimes to get out of your normal, familiar context of ministry to serve with others, to glean from them, to see things that you might normally miss. I've enjoyed the van rides down and back from Harrisburg where I can just talk about following Jesus and hear ministry stories from April and Angel who started this ministry known as Isaiah 61, which many of us are familiar with (if not, go to www.isaiah61ministries.org)

For Angel and April, ministry is much more than a program, a particular leader or personality, a set schedule—ministry is LIFE. Life with Jesus and life with others. You just have to spend ten minutes with them to figure it out. On the ride home from Harrisburg yesterday evening, Angel and I were talking about church life today. He noted that so many churches have many people, many groups, and many programs. He reflected, the churches in this region, they have so many great people and groups, if they could just get the church to go OUT into the community, to really meet people where they're at, learn their needs, and love them, we would be a force on this earth!

He's right.

No one has it all figured out, we're all on the path of growing more and more into the fullness of Christ. But on the way, part of that journey is following Him out of the building, into the world.

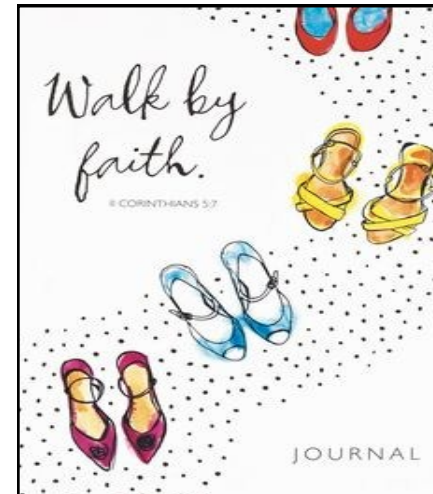
Faith in Action Sunday is about that: it's about worshiping Christ by following His calling to be about more than a building or a worship service. To be a *people* who love and serve.

Patriotic trivia for July

As we celebrate America's birthday, it's interesting to note that clergymen wrote both the Pledge of Allegiance and the hymn "My Country 'Tis of Thee." Rev. Francis Bellamy wrote the pledge in 1892. Rev. Samuel Francis Smith wrote the hymn in 1831. Both men were Baptist ministers.

The pledge was first used in public schools in 1892 during Columbus Day observances. "My Country 'Tis of Thee" was used as a national song before "The Star-Spangled Banner" was named America's national anthem in 1931.
