Your child has attended a presentation demonstrating string instruments and inviting him or her to participate in the Ames Community School orchestra program.

All students are capable of learning a string instrument, even with no prior musical training. A commitment to the program is sure to bring many rewards.

Please take some time to read through the brochure and discuss it with your child. If you would like to enroll your child in the Ames School Orchestra program, complete the form in the brochure and return it to your child's classroom teacher.

The Orchestral String Instrument Family

The violin is the smallest. It plays the highest pitched notes and is sometimes called the soprano of the string family. The violin player holds the instrument with his or her chin.

The viola is larger than the violin, but like the violin is played while held under the chin. It is sometimes called the alto of the string family.

The cello is larger than a viola, and is sometimes called the tenor of the string family. A cello player sits and holds the instrument between his or her knees.

The bass is the largest of the string instruments and plays the lowest notes. A bass player holds the bass upright while sitting or standing.

The Ames Community School District has an active orchestra program from 4th to 12th grade. Instruction for beginners is offered for the first time in 4th grade. Beginners at later grade levels are welcome.

More advanced instruction for those who have begun private lessons before 4th grade is likewise available, and advanced students are encouraged to improve their musicianship and leadership skills in the school program.

The goal of the program is not to become a professional musician, though some students do, but to ensure students make good progress toward becoming well-rounded musicians who can play and appreciate music.

Students who participate in the program work on large and fine motor skills, listening skills, reading skills, coordination, cooperation, leadership, and group participation. They also develop friendships, perform, travel, and generally have fun!
