

Bibliography Worksheet

Short Form**World Wide Web**

Use this worksheet to cite information and articles from the Internet. Follow the appropriate model below when formatting your bibliography. Because there is no standardized format used on the Internet, the information provided on each web page varies significantly. *Use whatever information is available.* At a minimum, include the title of the web page, the date the page was accessed (viewed), and the “meaningful” URL. Evaluate the information you find on the web for accuracy and credibility.

***NOTE:** URLs are now optional in MLA format, but at Lansing Middle School students are required to include the “meaningful” URL. At a minimum go up to the .com, .org, .gov., etc.

Generic Example:

“Title of page or article.” *Title of Website*. Date of access. <“Meaningful” URL (see *NOTE: above) [http://etc](#) >.

Example:

“Hydraulic Fracturing.” *Safewater Home*. 15 Mar. 2010. <<http://www.epa.gov>>.

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“Title of Web Page.”.....

Example: 29 July 2009. < URL up to .com, .org, .gov., etc
