In your nomination, please address the items listed below. Any additional information or documentation you would like to send to support your nomination is welcome, e.g., articles, biographical sketches, resumes, etc.

1. Name, address, phone numbers (day and evening), e-mail address and class year of nominee.
2. Educational background.
3. Current and past positions in the area of social & behavioral sciences and humanities. Include job title, locale, responsibilities, activities/projects, and other related accomplishments and contributions. You may also include recognition or honors received and professional affiliations. Please include dates where possible.
4. Description of the nominee's character and commitment as it relates to this award.
5. Your name, address, E-mail, phone number and class year, if applicable.
6. Nominators are strongly encouraged to seek other individuals to write letters in support of their nomination. A minimum of two letters of support is recommended.

Your nomination letter should be no longer than two pages, single spaced.
