Teaching and learning at Renaissance embraces heterogeneous grouping, differentiated instruction, student-led family conferences, small group learning, and time for remedial support within classes and throughout the middle and high school programs. Literacy instruction is a focus for academic areas, and regular formative assessments provide students, families and teachers with the data and feedback required for successful teaching and learning. The school's Crew course is a key component to its student support program.</p> <p>Flexible scheduling and team planning throughout the middle and high school academic programs allow for frequent teacher collaboration and coordination between disciplines. Advanced Placement and honors courses are offered in 11th and 12th grades.</p> <p>The school has many school programs, hosted by school staff and partner agencies.
