Read the article "Toy Stories: The psychology of toys" posted on E-Campus. Pick a toy or hobby that relates to some particular age group (i.e. a mobile for an infant or golf in the elderly). You will need to get approval from the instructor for your choice of toy/hobby prior to writing this paper.

Using what you have learned in the class, you will need to complete a paper that answers the following questions:

- 1. Describe the developmental benefits of your toy or hobby. Be specific.
- 2. What are the physical, cognitive or perceptual challenges that face the age group that you are relating the toy/hobby to?
- 3. How does your toy/hobby help this group meet those challenges?
- 4. How does it fail?
- 5. What improvements could be made to your toy/hobby to help it meet those needs?

Be sure to cite specific references in APA format from both your book/class notes and the article posted. (An APA style guide has been posted on E-Campus). You may use additional primary (Journal Articles) or secondary (Textbooks) sources, but I will not count any tertiary sources (Websites / Wikipedia / Blogs) as contributing information to this assignment.

Papers must be submitted with the following criteria or they will not be graded:

- ➤ 1" margins on all sides
- > 12 point Times New Roman, Ariel or Helvetica Font
- > Cover page including your name and toy or hobby chosen

Your paper must be 4 to 6 typed double-spaced pages (not including the title page or any references). To be precise, this means that you must have between 4 2/3 pages and 6 pages of text. Please do not turn in a paper shorter than 4 2/3 pages or longer than 6 pages.

The paper will be graded on the basis of several characteristics:

- 1. The extent to which your paper integrates material from the lecture and textbook and offers insight on the topic.
- 2. Your original thinking and creativity in analyzing the benefits / cons of the toy of hobby chosen in terms of how it helps or does not help certain aspects of development.
- 3. Writing style, including organization, sentence structure, clarity of expression and other stylistic issues.

The grading rubric for this assignment is attached so you can see exactly what I am looking for.
