Instructions for Schedule R

Allocation Schedule for Aggregate Form 940 Filers

General Instructions

Purpose of Schedule R (Form 940)

Use Schedule R (Form 940) to allocate the aggregate information reported on Form 940 to each home care service recipient client. An aggregate Form 940 may only be filed by section 3504 Agents acting on behalf of home care service recipients. If you are an agent for home care service recipients and have more than 15 clients, complete continuation sheets as necessary. Attach Schedule R (Form 940), including any continuation sheets, to your aggregate Form 940 and file it with your return.

Who Must File?

You must complete Schedule R (Form 940) each time you file an aggregate Form 940, Employer's Annual Federal Unemployment (FUTA) Tax Return. Aggregate Forms 940 are filed by agents of home care service recipients approved by the IRS under section 3504 of the Internal Revenue Code. To request approval to act as an agent for an employer, you must file Form 2678, Employer/Payer Appointment of Agent, with the IRS, unless you are a state or local government agency acting as agent under the special procedures provided in Notice 2003-70. On Schedule R (Form 940), we call those employers your clients.

When Must You File?

If you are an aggregate Form 940 filer, file Schedule R (Form 940) with your aggregate Form 940 every year when your Form 940 is due.

Specific Instructions

Completing Schedule R (Form 940)

Enter Your Business Information

Carefully enter your employer identification number (EIN) and the name of your business at the top of the schedule. Make sure they exactly match the EIN and name shown on the attached Form 940.

Calendar Year

Enter the calendar year for which you are filing your Form 940. Make sure that the year entered on the top of Schedule R (Form 940) matches the year on Form 940.

On Schedule R (Form 940), including any continuation sheets, you must report the following for each client:

- Your client's employer identification number (EIN).
- The state abbreviation of the listed client's location.
- Total taxable FUTA wages (line 7 of Form 940) allocated to the listed client EIN.

Total adjustments to FUTA tax (line 9 or line 10 of Form 940) allocated to the listed client EIN.

Credit reduction amount (line 11 of Form 940) allocated to the listed client EIN.

Total FUTA tax after adjustments (line 12 of Form 940) allocated to the listed client EIN.

Total FUTA tax deposits for the tax year plus any other payments (line 13 of Form 940) allocated for the listed client EIN.

You must also report the same information for your employees on line 18 of Schedule R (Form 940).

Compare the total of each column on line 19 (including your information on 18) to the amounts reported on the aggregate Form 940. For each column total, the relevant line from Form 940 is noted in the column heading.

If the totals on line 19 of the Schedule R (Form 940) do not match the totals on Form 940, there is an error that must be corrected before submitting Form 940 and Schedule R (Form 940).

Paperwork Reduction Act Notice. We ask for the information on Schedule R (Form 940) to carry out the Internal Revenue laws of the United States. You are required to give us this information. We need it to ensure that you are complying with these laws and to allow us to figure and collect the right amount of tax.

You are not required to provide the information requested on a form that is subject to the Paperwork Reduction Act unless the form displays a valid OMB control number. Books or records relating to a form or its instructions must be retained as long as their contents may become material in the administration of any Internal Revenue law. Generally, tax returns and return information are confidential, as required by section 6103.

The time needed to complete and file Schedule R (Form 940) will vary depending on individual circumstances. The estimated average time is:

Recordkeeping	10 hrs., 45 min.
Learning about the law or the form0 hrs., 12 min.
Preparing, copying, assembling, and sending form to IRS	0 hrs., 00 min.
