Doing this is not always going to be easy. Choosing the high road of spirituality will constantly be a challenge, but it is within our power, or else the Holy Spirit through the apostle Paul would not have given us the above command. There's no telling how much we can accomplish if we just decide today that we would let Jesus rule our moods rather than the circumstances of the world.


