Charm Squares Sue Stepp / Pat Clark


For March, please bring 21 light green squares. The following quilters have signed up: Assimus*, Barnes*, Cahill*, Clark*, Conlon*, Doyle, Frenza*, Giardullo, Grambling*, Kessenich, Luby*, McLaughlin*, Navarra*, Rowell*, Schiff, Sitner*, Stepp*, Stessin*, Urbon*, Williams*, and Wodin*.

Colors for the rest of the year are as follow: April - purple, May - yellow, and June - bold blue. Names with an '*' have signed up for the entire year. If you anticipate participating all season long, please place a star next to your name on next month's sign-up sheet. Those who want to sign up month by month are welcome to participate.

Fabric cut for the squares should be pre-washed, without selvages. Squares should be cut precisely 6 1/2" by 6 1/2", so that they can be readily used. The colors/themes will be different every month.

Unless called for, please don't use novelty fabrics. The squares will fit nicely into a one-quart Ziploc- type baggie, so please bring one with your name on it. Place your squares on top, and we will distribute your fabric and return your baggie to you filled with all the different fabrics!

March 219, 2016: Community Sewing

We will be making Snowballs!! I will have fabric for the project. We will be using 6 1/2" squares and 2 1/2" squares of UNBLEACH muslin for the corner pieces.

You will need a sewing machine with a 1/4" foot, your power cord and foot control. [if you have a long power cord you may need it] A neutral thread it good. A small iron and pad, also a small mat, rotary cutter, a 61/2" ruler, a 1" X 6" ruler and a pencil. Be sure your name is on your equipment. If you have never made Snowballs, stay and learn how!! If you have fabric cut into 6 1/2" squares, you can bring some of your own, JUST BE SURE THEY ARE EXACT SIZE.

Denim Jean Vest Class With Evelyn Urbom

Supply List:

- 1. Fabric cutting shears
- 2. Thread snips
- 3. Deninm colored thread
- 4. Thread to co-ordinate with lining fabric
- 5. Acrylic ruler (6" x 19")
- 6. Marking pen
- 7. Straight ins
- 8. Sewing machine
- 9. Iron and pressing mat (we can share if you don't have your own)
- 10. Old denim jeans (make sure there are no holes in the knees
- 11. Fabric for lining and vest front and back (check your patterns for requirements) plus 1/4 yard more

Homework:

- 1. Remove both rear end pockets and bring them with you to class
- 2. Open inner leg seams of jeans
- You will need to make trim for both the upper right and lower left sides of the top band make it approx. 2 1/2"-4" wide by 7" - 10" long. The lower band 4" wide x the width of the vest front (measure your tissue pattern). I suggest the ling fabric plus 1 or 2 contrasting fabrics. You could make a 4-patch windmill or a Seminole type band.
