Welcome (or welcome back) to JEI for the 2015-2016 school year! We have had a productive first couple of weeks and look forward to a great year. I am sure you have heard that JEI is hosting the SECOND ANNUAL TROJAN TOUGH 5K WALK/RUN on October 10th. JEI staff and our amazing PTA are investing a great deal of time and effort into this event. Students must be dropped off at school the day they leave for camp between 8:00am and 8:20am and picked up the day they return around 1:45pm. Students may not ride the bus with their camp gear.

Students will also need one sack lunch for the day they leave for camp. These may be purchased through the school cafeteria on individual student lunch accounts or they may bring one from home. Please let your homeroom teacher know if you need a lunch!

Jenks Wild Medications

Attention ALL PARENTS of Jenks Wild Campers

Please bring all medication to your student's <u>teacher</u> the <u>morning of departure</u>. Medication must be in its original container (prescription and nonprescription medication with <u>original label intact</u>.) Nonprescription medication must be labeled age appropriately. (This means that if a bottle is labeled do not give to children under a certain age, it will NOT be given without a physician's note if your child is under that age. <u>PLEASE READ THE LABEL</u>.) No medication can be given to a child unless accompanied by a currently completed "Jenks Wild request to give medication" form. No nutritional/herbal/homeopathic supplements (example melatonin) will be given without a note from a physician. All inhalers must be marked with student's name and have prescription label. In order for your child to carry an inhaler the nurse must have a back up and your physician must sign a school authorization form per Oklahoma State Law. No sample medications will be given without a note from prescribing physician. Place all medications and forms in a Ziploc bag with student & teacher's name. <u>If medication is NOT in compliance with the above, it can NOT be given.</u> Please send just enough medication for the duration of camp.

*Camp clinic has NO MEANS to reach a student who does not come for medication.

SUPPLIES FOR JENKS WILD

Below is a list of supplies for Jenks Wild. Each person will be allowed one bedroll/sleeping bag and one duffle bag or "squishy" suitcase. (It is imperative that you follow these guidelines in order to make loading the buses easier). Avoid bringing newly purchased clothing. Remember, you are camping and hiking.

Bedding: A sleeping bag or bedroll and one pillow. Beds are bunk beds.

1 pairs of pants, 2 pairs of shorts

3 changes of underwear, 3 pairs of socks

3 t-shirts

Sleepwear

1 pair of sneakers, no sandals or platform shoes

Water Shoes (students will be hiking in a creek. Flip flops will not work. These could be old tennis shoes.)

1 lightweight jacket/sweatshirt

Raincoat/poncho/garbage bag

Shower shoes

1 towel and 2 washcloths

Laundry bag

Soap in a zip-lock bag, Shampoo (small plastic bottle)

Brush or comb

Toothbrush and toothpaste

Deodorant, kleenex

Backpack with the following items: Pencils and hat

*Luggage tags on your bedroll, suitcase and backpack (please label)

Optional Items: Camera and film, sunglasses, sunscreen, chapstick, insect repellant, water bottle


