NOTES

These notes are to help you complete your application. Please read them carefully. More detailed information about Northumberland schools can be found in the Admissions Handbook published annually and also available on the Northumberland County Council website www.northumberland.gov.uk/admissions In addition each school must produce a school brochure containing information specific to that particular school.

Applications on behalf of children who are resident in other local education authority areas will be considered in the same way as applications from Northumberland residents.

If information is received that a place in a preferred school has been obtained on the basis of a false statement of address, the County Council reserves the right to withdraw the offer of a place.

Parents have the right to appeal against being refused a place at any of the schools they have requested on the application form. Details of how to appeal will be sent to parents with the outcome of their application.

PLANNED ADMISSION NUMBERS

Each school has a planned admissions number which is based upon the capacity of the school. As an Admissions Authority we cannot normally exceed that number other than at appeal. Once a year group has achieved the Planned Admission Number for that year then further applications will be refused. If you live in Northumberland an alternative school will be offered instead.

HOME TO SCHOOL TRANSPORT

Generally, the County Council provides home to school transport for children attending the appropriate school for their address and when the distance from home to school is more than two miles for first school age children and more than three miles for middle and high school age children. Under normal circumstances, if the school you are applying for is not the appropriate school for your address the County Council will not provide transport. When we are unable to offer you a place at your appropriate school, we will only provide transport to the next nearest available school, as long as it is further than the distance given above.

DENOMINATIONAL AND FOUNDATION SCHOOLS

When a request is made for a school on denominational grounds, this reason should be clearly stated in the box "reason for preference" next to the school name. Decisions on admission to all Faith, Foundation, Voluntary Aided, Trust Schools and Academies are made by the governing bodies of those schools. Parents should make clear on this form if their preference for the school is made on the grounds of religious conviction and may be asked for evidence to support their application (such as a letter from their local clergy).

Entitlement to school transport is based on denomination and not religious conviction; that is you should be a member of the Roman Catholic church in order that your child receives home to school transport to your nearest Roman Catholic school and similarly, you need to be a member of the Church of England in order that your child receives home to school transport to your nearest Church of England school. Parents will be asked to provide evidence of their claim, such as a baptism certificate or letter from local clergy. Transport will only be provided where the distance from home to school is considered reasonable by the County Council and, in any case, over two miles for first school aged children and over three miles for middle and high school aged children.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

From September 2002, Local Authorities and schools must make reasonable adjustments to ensure that the needs of disabled pupils are met. The School Admissions Code defines disability as a physical or mental impairment that has a substantial and long-term adverse effect on the ability to carry out normal day-to-day activities. If you feel that your child falls into this category, please provide details on a separate sheet. Please note that the information you provide will not be used to decide which pupils are offered places. We need the information only to allow us to make any necessary preparations or adjustments at the school concerned.

Applications for mid-year transfers are normally processed within ten working days of receipt. If you have not had a response to your request within three weeks of posting or handing the form into the school, please ring The School Admissions Team on 01670 534162.
