The transformation of Woking Town Centre under the Conservatives has continued with news that Côte will be the latest restaurant to occupy Commercial Way.

CARL COMBATING SPEEDING

CONSERVATIVES EYE PROGRESS ON ARCH

Conservatives have welcomed news that Network Rail is starting a study that could result in a wider, pedestrian-friendly Victoria Arch.

Mount Hermon Councillor Carl Thomson said: "As your councillor, I have been campaigning to improve Victoria Arch for many years.

"I am pleased that Network Rail has agreed to take this study forward. Although the start work is still some time away, residents can be confident a solution is being sought.

"Along with my colleagues David Bittleston and Mark

Pengelly, I have also pressed Woking Borough Council to support bringing Crossrail 2 to the area as well as a direct rail link to Heathrow and am delighted

DAVID PRIORITISES WOKING AFFORDABLE HOUSING

As Deputy Leader of Woking Borough Council, David Bittleston has made the

delivery of social housing and affordable homes in Woking a priority to help hardworking families in Mount Hermon get onto the housing ladder.

Homes recently approved

include 154 as part of the Hoe Valley Scheme: 250 street properties brought back into use and a strategy to put a further 880 empty homes onto the market at affordable rates.



Conservatives have also delivered the Moor Lane Project where 371 homes

are being built. The Sheerwater Regeneration, if approved, will provide 400 homes and the Victoria Square development 392 flats.

David said: "With so many people waiting for decent, affordable homes, and families in Mount Hermon unable to get on the property ladder, I hope to be able to continue prioritising the delivery of new, high quality homes in Woking."

HOE VALLEY SCHOOL A BOOST FOR PARENTS

Local parent and Conservative campaigner Mark Pengelly has welcomed the decision by Woking Borough Council to grant planning permission, subject to Secretary of State Approval, for the Hoe Valley School on Egley Road.

The school will be able to accommodate 840 pupils and will come with an eight-lane, all weather athletics track, leisure facilities, a five star sports hall, gym, fitness suite, two full-sized grass football pitches. and three all weather pitches. Mark said: "As a parent myself, I know just how nerve-wracking it can be to worry about getting your child into a successful nearby school.

"Subject to approval, The Hoe Valley School will provide hundreds of additional, high-quality places for kids in our area, meaning that parents won't be forced to transport their children to the other side of town."
