

SAMPLE BEQUEST LANGUAGE

The following language may aid you and your attorney in preparing your bequest to the University of Colorado Foundation for the benefit of the University of Colorado.

CONTINGENT BEQUEST

A contingent bequest names the CU Foundation as the recipient of your estate only in the event of a specified circumstance. For example, the CU Foundation may be named a contingent beneficiary if another beneficiary chooses not to accept a bequest, or if the beneficiary or beneficiaries named in your will are no longer living at the time of your death. For example, your contingent bequest might state:

"In the event that my designated beneficiary is no longer living at the time of my death, I bequeath (\$, % or residuary) to the University of Colorado Foundation, a Colorado nonprofit corporation, for the benefit of (campus, specific school, program, project or purpose) to be used (choose one)
