In each issue of Over the Hill and In the Know we put the spotlight on one of the Troupe's active members (actor, stage crew or other support functions). This issue's spotlight member is Letha Tibbitts.

Letha Tibbitts is a founding member and known best for all the hours she puts behind her keyboard. Letha has worked on nearly every production either at the keyboard or helped by supplying snacks for rehearsals. These past five years Letha helped get us going during our meetings and was a major part as "Lil' Bit" in *Swine Patch Junction*. Since Troupe's beginning, if there is music involved Letha is usually helping us out.

Letha was born in Jacksonville, Texas. Galena Park. Texas. became her home for many years. Letha went to school in Galena Park ISD from grades one through twelve. She even came back to Galena Park as a teacher after getting her degrees from San Jacinto Jr. College and then finishing with a Bachelors and Master's degrees from University of Houston Clear Lake. While in Galena Park she taught 7th grade reading for 17 years, along with 7 years as a high school literature teacher, while nights and evenings took up time teaching college prep reading and other night school reading classes.

Letha met the man of her dreams in high school, Bob. They have been married for 52 years. They have three sons and ten perfect grandchildren (well, almost perfect...ha)! The grands range in ages from 3 – 24. Letha was always very active in helping with Granny Camp when all the grands would participate. We have such fond memories of her skits with them.

Letha has retired three times. Once officially, but continued to work at the same job, while drawing that extra income from teacher retirement. Then again she retired from teaching, then did that again, then finally really retired

when they moved to Hilltop in 2004. While her children were young, Letha taught piano from home. She got a real estate license and did that for a while before going back to college to get a degree in reading.

They built their beautiful home in 2004. Their home has been the host location for



some of the Sammy Sneed Block parties, as well as a large New Year's Eve party for friends. They love to entertain. Being named the Hilltop Lakes Citizen of the Year in 2009 has honored Letha. She has been active in many organizations, church and school activities. At one time, she led a monthly birthday celebration for Hilltop residents.

A little tidbit about Letha, she swam in the Jr. Olympics during her teen years. She even won a few medals. Letha was the Lt. Colonel and charter member of the Galena Park Jacketeers during high school. Can you imagine those high kicks from her at the end of the drill team line?

Letha is very proud of being a member of Troupe Over The Hill and would give this advise to others. "It is a wonderful thing to entertain others and see them enjoy the productions. It is a blessing to be part of this group."
