FROM OUR PASTOR

June-August, 2014

Dear Finley Church family,

Summer is approaching and I am still wondering if the weather will "warm up" this year. I am writing to you about some exciting new ministries that will be happening with the addition of our new Associate Pastor, Derek and Jessica Trout. They have two young children, Rowyn (3) and Judah (2) who are a big part of their ministry and family, also. Our Staff Relations Committee Parish (SPRC) and I have been working for the past school year to pray, dream and compile a job description where we feel Finley Church needs help in focused areas.

Most churches in the United States are in decline. Those churches that aren't in decline are focusing on areas where most churches don't focus on – young adults. Most churches and families see their kids drop out of church after high school. This is why this population is largely heathen and unreached in our nation. If you go around to any event and see this age group, most of them are spiritually lost and have no direction of Christ in their lives.

Having said this, our committee and I have prayerfully discerned over where our new associate would put their time. We know senior high youth will be a portion of their time and another portion would be with our Young Adults (both single and married). Thirdly, we as a committee sensed small discipleship groups for all ages is an area growing churches focus on in developing disciples for Jesus Christ. So this, too, will be offered for anyone who desires to grow deeper in their faith development. These will be offered in 8 week classes (both fall and spring) each year.

Finley Church will see spiritual growth not only now (short term) but also 10-20 years down the road (long term) by adding new staff. Whenever we have "Snow Sunday's" (that is what I call them) we see about half of our congregation in church on these cold days. Meaning about 90-100 people are in attendance on a bad day. Whenever we have these – this gives me a chilling picture of where our church could end up in 10-20 years if we fail to reach people, continually.

This *picture* of a depleted church propels me to action. Long after I am gone and my JUNE/JULY/AUGUST 2014

ministry is over at Finley UMC, my prayer is that I have left it stronger and more vibrant than when I came. If I haven't, then I am a failure in my own eyes and heart. Praise God He has provided an opportunity for us to reach our city in a specific way of a new staffing position by a generous donor in our church family who believes in the mission of Finley UMC -*"Win the lost, whatever the cost"* (The Great Commission -Matthew 28:19-20).

How can you be a supporter of this new direction? By your: 1) Attitude. 2) Prayers. 3) Financial Support (we will be raising awareness of how you can help through "pledges" over and beyond the tithe). 4) Love – new Associate Pastor's family – Rev. Derek and Jessica Trout. Please welcome them later this summer like you have me and my family.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

At our last meeting on May 9, 2014, the Finance Committee, with the approval of Pastor Jerry Ernst, Chairperson of the Committee on Lay Leadership, has changed the responsibilities of two committee members. Kathy Thomas, who was designated as the Assistant Church Treasurer, was reassigned as the Assistant Financial Secretary. Beth Howell, who was designated as the Assistant Financial Secretary, was reassigned as the Assistant Church Treasurer.

As of our May church meetings, our Chase line of credit balance (outstanding on our roof projects) was \$23,937.79. The sooner we pay off this debt, the less overall interest charges we will incur.

An applicant has apparently accepted the offer made by the Staff Pastor/Parish Relations Committee to serve as Associate Pastor. This assignment could possibly take effect as early as this summer. A very gracious anonymous donor has voluntarily

offered to pay the expenses for this position for two years.

In order to adequately prepare for the financial obligation of maintaining this position beyond two years, we will not only need to be debt free, but may have to realign our future spending priorities.

Commissions and Committees will need to seriously start reviewing their current budgets for necessary reductions for 2015 and beyond. Everyone's cooperation will be needed in order to enable the new staff member to achieve expanded ministries this position will allow.

Much vision, hard work, and prayer by Pastor Jerry and the Staff Pastor/Parish Relations Committee went into the creation and filling of this new staff position. The plan and hope is that ministries, which support Finley's Mission Statement, will be enhanced by the Associate Pastor position. Continued support and prayer by all of us will be needed to make this expanded outreach successful.
