Individuals of legal voting age who are members of eligible Lutheran congregations.
(b) Associate membership in the Society shall be open to Christian congregations and individuals who are associated with Christian congregations and who subscribe to the purpose and bylaws of Kinasao. At all meetings of Kinasao, associate members shall have voice, but no vote. Individual associate members are not eligible for election to the Board, but may serve on committees.

 Membership is acquired by submitting a written request for membership, subject to Board approval. Membership is renewed annually by making a written request or making a charitable donation to Kinasao. The membership roster at December 31st of the given year shall be in force for the annual meeting held subsequent to the end of the year.

It is our custom to include a **POTLUCK SUPPER** as part of the fellowship we share at our meeting. We will do so again this year and invite you to bring items to share at the table. Supper will be served at the conclusion of the AGM.

Outdoor education camps continues to gain momentum and is full for the first time. There is much excitement also about the advanced Week in the Wild program to be offered this year.

3.4 Property Committee, Richard Monseler – Referred to report. Noted that they are investigating cost of spraying for tent caterpillars this year following last year's infestation. Many bears spotted on camp land last summer but precautions are being taken and public is being educated.

3.5 Treasurer, Kari Alford - Kari reviewed the financial report. It has been a challenging year financially but once again the year end appeal was very successful. Heartfelt thanks. As mentioned earlier, the Board will look at a long term plan with a possible view to an operating model that would be less reliant on donations.

On behalf of the Board, I would like to thank all those who support the camp through sharing their time, talents or finances with us. We very much appreciate it.

We value the contributions that all of our Board members have made to Kinasao, and give special thanks to departing members: Gordon Cochrane, Jason Johnson and Dale White. We give thanks for the hard work of the year-round staff, Kari, Kristi, Katee, Richard and Hali, as well as their families.

Executive Director's Report 2015

75 years of ministry! What a celebration! It was a great year as we remembered and honored the history of Kinasao, from the discovery and purchase of this property and the establishment of the permanent camp site to the families and generations who have been a part of Kinasao since its beginning and throughout the years. We spent time looking to the future and what God has in store for this ministry and for all who have yet to come and experience God's love and the love of His people through this camp. May the next 75 years be as blessed and be as much of a blessing as the past 75 have been! God is SO GOOD!

Celebration Weekend was a special time with a number of people sharing their experiences at camp over the years with great stories and memories, and many more people who added video clips to our Memory DVD. Some special crafts were made and auctioned off including stained glass crosses made from the original glass of the cross in the chapel and an engraved cribbage board signifying the 75th Anniversary, as well as many other beautiful items. Our 75th Anniversary Banquet in August was an amazing celebration with wonderful fellowship, great food, incredible entertainment and an outpouring of support for this camp! We would like to thank everyone who was a part of these celebrations!

2015 was a year of stability, strength and growth in many areas. We give thanks to God for providing for the camp in so many ways and for all of the people who gave with their hearts, hands and gifts throughout the year.

Our Staff:

Kinasao has been blessed with both a strong year round staff and an energetic and experienced summer staff. Kari Alford continues as the Executive Director, having 8 full years under her belt. Kristi Stolee continues as the Assistant Director with a wide variety of responsibilities. We pray for Kristi and her husband, lan, as they expect their first child this March. Richard and Hali Monseler continue as the Site Managers, having good control over the property and facilities we are blessed with. This year we also welcomed Katee Pederson onto our staff as a Program Intern. She is learning about the various roles and duties required to run a year round ministry and will be taking over the Program Director role this spring and summer.

We had an incredible carryover of summer staff in 2015 with almost everyone either being a repeat staff or a recent SIT. This made for a great team with lots of experience to lean on as well as great creative ideas about how to make things new and fresh. These young people are amazing leaders with hearts dedicated to sharing God's love in a wide variety of ways. They are the heart of our summer camp and we thank each one of them for giving so generously to this place.

Our Volunteers:

This camp could not continue as it does without the help of so many people. We have a great Board of Directors who give of their time throughout the year to govern, support and direct this ministry. Thanks to each of you. We have pastors and resource staff who lead our Sunday services, provide the spiritual leadership for our weeks of camp and who speak and teach at our retreats. You are all appreciated! And we have many people who provide work in many ways from taking down trees and chopping wood, to building and assisting with projects, to lending us machinery and giving of their time. We couldn't do this without you! To everybody who attends our camps, our worship services, our BBQ lunches, stays in our campground, and enjoys this place called Kinasao – YOU are the people, the fellowship, the family, the community that shares the love of God with each other. We are so blessed that you are a part of it!

Our Camps:

We have seen growth in our Outdoor Education Camps in the three years they have run, going from 200 participants to over 400 this year, with more than that already registered for 2016. This is such a great way to have kids come and experience the amazing natural world around us, to build relationships and to increase their personal confidence and self-esteem. Our staff are great role models for these kids and these programs will continue to grow and evolve as we strive to support and meet the needs of the schools in our area.

We are excited that our Week in the Wild programs continue, now offering three levels of this wilderness camping experience. The first level focuses on building skills from canoeing and orienteering, outdoor cooking and plant identification, while staying "close to home". The second level puts these skills to the test, taking the campers on a multi-night canoe trip off site. We are excited to now be able to offer canoe certification during the third level week-long off site canoe trip. The kids who have been through this whole program are now experienced trippers with a love of the wilderness and God's awesome creation.

We hosted our first "Kinasao Community Camp" in 2015, a day camp run at Messiah Lutheran Church in Prince Albert. We want to reach as many kids as possible with the camp experience but know that not all kids are able to come to camp here at Kinasao. So we are bringing camp to them! Huge thanks goes out to the congregation for supporting and hosting this week. We hope to run multiple Community Camps in 2016.

We saw an increase in attendance in our summer camps, family camp and Outdoor Education camps this year. We hope to build on that this year.

Our Property:

Our campground is another area of growth for Kinasao. We are experiencing a high demand for our long term campsites and a strong community of support has grown among those who spend much of their summer here in the campground. We are excited to be taking on a campground expansion project

this coming year, adding additional fully serviced, long term sites. We will begin by adding about 20 sites with the possibility of another 10-15 as the project moves along. There will be lots of work to do on this project this summer, so if you would like to volunteer, we would be very happy to hear from you! Contact the camp office or campground host if you are willing to help out!

We have received permission from the District of Lakeland to have a "community dock" on our beach which will be a multi-slip dock available to anyone who holds a lease on Kinasao property, whether in the campground or a lakefront lot. Slips will be rented out seasonally. Let the camp office know if you are a lease holder who would like a slip for the coming summer.

Our Finances:

We had an interesting year financially in that most areas of revenue came in slightly over budget, which meant we were not as dependent on donations to meet our total budget. But seemingly as a result, our general donations were significantly below those received in the past couple of years. In the end, we were within 1% of our total budgeted income and within 1% of our total budgeted expenses, and ended the year in the positive. We give thanks for this year of financial stability and appreciate all who donated so generously throughout the year.

The coming year will include budgeted amounts for a number of capital projects including the campground expansion, replacing of the "blinds" on the dining shelter, adding porches to the kids cabins (in the process of repairing rotting boards on the cabin fronts), upgrades to staff housing and the purchase of some new mattresses and new program equipment. Please support these projects as you are able as we continue to enhance and improve our property and our programs.

As we look to our past and celebrate the success and growth of this camp, we learn from the trials and challenges, and glean wisdom and direction from those who have walked before us. We look to the future with excitement and anticipation, knowing that God will provide growth and success, trial and challenge, but ultimately, through it all, His love and blessing on many more years of ministry at Kinasao. Our theme for the summer of 2016 is "Walk in the WAY of Love" and we pray that God will teach us and guide us as we strive to follow Christ's example as we walk in the WAY of love this coming year.

Thank you for being a part of this ministry, for your support and encouragement and participation in this great place we call KINASAO!!

2015 Program Report

Summer 2015 began amongst our staff with the theme "Revived to Thrive" as we committed to work towards an intentional faith to help see our lives, camper's lives, and Kinasao as a whole renewed and flourishing. We worked hard during staff training to switch things up to keep staff and campers on their toes, instead of expecting the same old same old. Our staff was made up of a majority returning members who brought with them experience, wisdom, along with fresh ideas on how to build on last summer's successes.

The new staff were immediately aware of the positive, Christ-centered, and family-like culture set by the returning staff and joined in seamlessly. A number of veteran staff have recognized their time to move on from Kinasao into new areas of serving God, while others are looking to take on more leadership here at Kinasao next summer. The growth seen in staff this summer, both spiritually and within their position, was immeasurable.

For myself, making the jump from counsellor to Program Intern made for a steep learning curve and new relationship dynamics among the returning staff and my close friends. Through open communication, a great deal of support from Kristi and Kari, and a lot of prayer I positively completed my first summer as a year round staff member!

We continued to have positive experiences with our Outdoor Education Camps working with schools across the province in May and June. The program is growing and contributes to more kids experiencing Kinasao and God's love for them.

We had many special programs happening this summer, including some brand new ones. Youth Leadership saw growing numbers and nearly all of the Week in the Wild Advanced campers from last year returned (along with Volunteer Guide Barret Miller) for a 5 day trip on the South Saskatchewan River (the trip had to be moved south due to forest fires in the north). We did not run an intermediate week as planned due to low registration.

Extreme Teen Weekend was a huge hit with the smaller group of teens we had participating in crazy adventures throughout the weekend of family camp. Family camp had a great attendance with positive feedback from parents and children alike. The parents especially enjoyed their evenings off with planned events while our staff babysat.

We had one week of a Kinasao Community Camp at Messiah Lutheran Church in Prince Albert. Kids who might not otherwise be able to come out to Kinasao were able to experience the joy of camp and God's love in their own community at a subsidized price with the help of the church.

We also introduced some new songs during chapel this summer that got kids praising God with so much energy! "My Lighthouse" and "Deep Cries Out" were unanimous favorites.

Something particularly special for me was seeing the SIT's and other teens grow in their faith and leadership this summer. Hearing their stories of the impact Kinasao has had on their lives has been extremely powerful. The SIT program continues to provide youth with the opportunity to experience different roles at camp and aids the staff with their busy workload.

In the fall we ran a Youth Retreat as well as a separate Extreme Teen Night in Saskatoon. We had 30 campers registered for each event, which doubled our youth and teen retreat held in fall 2014.

2015 Summer Curriculum – Never Ending Love

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength." Deuteronomy 6:5

Our curriculum this summer built on "Awesome God Awesome Love" from last year, to show campers how truly never ending that awesome love is. In Chapel and Bible Study we looked at Abraham, Moses and the Israelites, Naomi and Ruth, Jonah, and Jeremiah, and the role God's love played in their lives. We explored how deeply God loves us, and how we can in turn share that love with others. When asked what they learnt about God this summer, a large number of campers said something along the lines of "God will always love and forgive us, no matter what." What an awesome and transforming truth!

I am beyond thankful for the opportunity to take on this new role at Kinasao and for everyone who has supported me in the transition. I am excited for continued growth and new adventures ahead!

Property Report 2015

We did not start any new major projects in 2015 but instead looked to complete ongoing projects.

The campground kitchen was largely finished and provided the ideal location for a few communal meals, I'm sure Daryl will continue to tweak the building until all is exactly right.

The campground purchased an electric golf cart to replace the old one, my hope is to cycle the old cart back for use by housekeeping/maintenance/program and volunteers using it until it drops completely or is sold as an antique.

Two camper cabins had their vinyl floors replaced with OSB (oriented strand board) and a polyurethane finish, bringing our total replaced to four out of nine. Two to three more cabins will have their floors replaced this coming year. The OSB flooring is proving to hold up very well and we hope to have all floors replaced by 2017.

Extensive work was done on the corduroy road (leading out to the tipi meadow) including the building of two bridge sections; two more sections will be added in 2016.

The sod roof on the shelter in the tipi area was replaced with a new metal roof. Even after extensive repairs last winter, only one tipi was able to survive the summer season. This remaining tipi will be utilized as a meeting place at the tipi site, while smaller tents will be used for sleeping accommodations when required.

The commercial water heaters in the men's and women's bathhouses and the residential water heater in Mount Olive were all replaced this year.

The septic tanks for the main camp and the campground have all been numbered allowing us to monitor outflow and also pinpoint problems that arise with leaking tanks.

The emergency standby generator system was finally completed and Kinasao will be able to continue to operate through power outages with minimal disruption to program.

We have been blessed with many dedicated volunteers who have been instrumental in the continued smooth operation of this ministry - thank you! I look forward to working with many more volunteers in this coming year.

Financial Summary

Kinasao has been blessed in many ways over the years including the financial gifts of many who have supported the ministry of Kinasao. With the generous donations and good stewardship by all of the Kinasao staff, 2015 ended with a net income of \$8,991.42 after other income and expenses are taken into consideration.

In 2015 the total budgeted income was \$683,800, and our actual income was \$690,607. On the expense side the 2015 budget for expenses was \$641,915 and our actual expenses were \$646,511.

The 2016 budget reflects a modest increase in both income and expenses and is a realistic expectation for the year. The 2016 budget for income is \$719,800 and for expenses the budget is \$715,115 which will give us a net income of \$4,685.

In 2015 the board has begun several initiatives including a risk assessment. Many thanks to Shawn Follick for his help in leading the board through the risk assessment. While there is still more work to be done the process has begun and will need to be looked at regularly by the board to continue the process.

As has been mentioned in the past Financial Summaries that Kinasao's budget relies heavily on donations for our operating. This is not unlike make ministry organizations but the board is beginning to discern if this is something that should change in the future and what that might look like. While Kinasao will always need the financial support of the community to continue the ministry where those donations will be best used to continue the ministry.

It has been a pleasure working with the board and the Kinasao staff this year as the treasurer and we pray for guidance and wisdom as we continue to make the most of the financial blessings we have been given.
