Welcome back, we hope everyone had a wonderful winter break. We have a busy month ahead of us with midterm exams and course recommendations for next year. Teachers will be making recommendations for students for the 2016-2017 school year between now and January 12th. Teachers and counselors will be meeting with students to discuss their courses. Students will receive their recommendation forms on January 14th in homeroom. All forms are to be turned in to their 3rd period teacher on January 25th. Please contact your child's teacher or counselor if you have a question. On January 14th from 6:30 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. we are planning to have an information night for our parents and students to review 2016-17 course offerings. Breakout sessions will include English, Math, Social Studies, Science, Related Arts, Technology and World Language. In addition we will have sessions on Naviance Training, AP test Registration, GT Research, Project Lead the Way, ARL programs, AHS Career Academics, AP Course Expectations, AP Course Information, and Freshman scheduling. Please join us!

As we think ahead, there will be several opportunities for seniors to speak or perform at the commencement ceremony. Any graduating senior is eligible to speak or perform and in order to be considered, the senior will audition in front of a panel of teachers. Auditions will be held on February 2, 2016 at 2:30 PM in the Choir room. Any senior who would like the opportunity to audition should sign up for a time slot on the bulletin board in the media center. Parents, a **diploma signature form** must be completed and signed by you, and returned to the student services office no later than January 22, 2016. Ms. Beneski, Student Services Secretary, must receive this form from all graduating seniors so we can be sure that all names are correctly spelled on diplomas. While we are on the topic of graduation, two additional changes have been made to our commencement ceremony procedures. Collaboratively the high schools decided to go with a single color gown for graduation and students will line up in alphabetical order to receive their diplomas. These changes will allow families to better predict when their student's name will be called and will facilitate the efficient distribution of diplomas. Seniors will be participating in an assembly on January 14th during homeroom and we are planning on having our senior class pick the color for our graduation gown this year. We will be presenting a few options with an accent trim color. The *League of Women's Voters* will also provide an opportunity for seniors to register to vote. Each senior is expected to bring (1) driver's license or last four digits of SSN; (2) a decision on voter affiliation--note MD has a closed primary election; and (3) a ball point pen to complete the application.

Seniors will also receive an order packet for graduation attire (cap and gown) and accessories from our Balfour representative Mr. Mahoney.
