

Friends of Children (FOC) and **Friends of Youth (FOY)**



Peter* is a boy with special needs. He attends mainstream school. At age 14, Peter's classmates began to extort from him. This was the first of many incidences of teasing and bullying that Peter endured. However, Peter kept silent about it to avoid adding to the hardship of the family as they coped with his mum's incarceration and meeting their financial needs.

Peter's silence caused the bullying to escalate. At 15, he endured his classmates humiliating him while they recorded the incident on their camera phones. His classmates then posted the video on a popular social networking website. This video was viewed by his cousin who informed his parents and brought the bullying to the attention of his family, school and the caseworker of Life Community Services Society (LCSS).

Peter shared that he felt very hurt by his classmates. However, he does have true friends. These true friends are in FOY's guitar interest group which he attends weekly. "Youths in the group are like family to me. They are my true friends," shares Peter.

Peter was part of our FOC program that aims to provide care and support for children (7-13yrs old) with parent/s presently/formerly incarcerated. He has grown to be part of FOY which is an activity-based program to befriend and mentor youths (12-19 years old) with parent/s presently/formerly incarcerated, to equip them with life skills and impart values.

Skills development – In developing practical skills, our youths learn diligence, responsibility and commitment. These skills are necessary in life as they grow into adulthood.


Youths meet weekly to learn the guitar. Though novice, they contributed back to Life Community by performing at our 15th Anniversary and Seagate's Charity Dinners.

Our Challenges

- 1. We require approximately 100 befrienders to befriend and mentor the children and youths in our programme as the number of clients continues to grow.
- 2. We require approximately \$72,000 to provide tuition to 20 children and youths this fiscal year.
- We need more corporations and individual donors to support our cause through fund raising and donations for the continuation of the running of the programme for our clients.

Life Student Care (LSC)

Eric* is a 9 year old boy who is usually polite, cooperative and calm towards his teachers. However, he has difficulty in relating to his peers. Eric was observed to have trouble controlling his emotions and would display sudden bursts of emotions towards his friends. As a result, Eric does not have many friends. Life Student Care Centre's teachers and supervisor gave him the space to learn to manage his emotions and guided him in building his social skills. With support from Eric's mother, the Centre staff has gone further to work with the school in referring Eric for school counselling to help him cope with the same challenges in the school setting. His mother has been very encouraged by the Centre staff's efforts.

LSC reaches out to primary school children in the community regardless of race, language or religion by rendering affordable quality before and after school student care services. All activities at the centre are focused around the "SPICES" programme which emphasizes on the total development of the child.



We welcome parent volunteers and corporate sponsors to conduct enrichment activities to further enhance the lives of our children.


MightyKids, Families and Community (MKFC)



A family recently shifted to the Telok Blangah vicinity from Jurong West. Their child, Samuel* had difficulty travelling the long distance between school and home. His mother is a dialysis patient and his father works long hours. He soon stopped going to school. Samuel did not attend school for a few months and this was brought to the attention of MKFC. The staff and volunteers of MKFC proceeded to assist the family in officially withdrawing their child from the previous school and securing a place for him in a school within the vicinity.

MightyKids, Families and Community is a programme that believes in the potential and value of every child as well as the importance of the family unit being foundational to the growth and progress of the community. We seek to affirm each child and nurture them to live an empowered life through social and emotional support within a loving and learning environment.




Corporate Social Responsibility

- The three children shared that they miss their mother a lot, especially the oldest boy.
- The three children will be placed in a children's home in early June.
- Children are anxious about the decision and need emotional (especially the oldest boy) and financial support.
- The children need preparation as they transit and adapt to a children's home.
