Stephen has taught both traditional and digital photography at the college level, and has lectured at numerous seminars and conferences in the United States and Europe.

Current projects include *With a New Eye*, an all digital national parks photographic project, digital panoramics, and his new book *Stephen Johnson On Digital Photography* being published by McGraw Hill in early 2005.

Stephen's work in digital photography has included software and product development for clients such as *Apple, Adobe, Eastman Kodak, Foveon, Epson, Hewlett Packard,* and *Leaf.* His work with Adobe includes the creation of the duotone curves shipped with their Photoshop software. His work was recently featured in *Life* Magazine and on ABC News/Discovery Channel's *Discovery News.*
