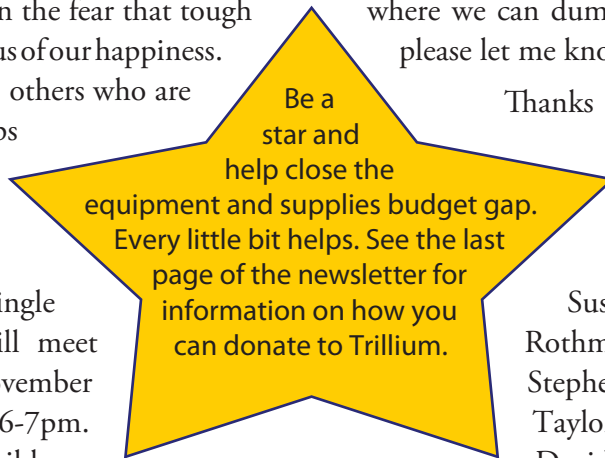
We are working to get a group going for parents of students with special needs. I will get back to you with information when it is available.

The success of Trillium in Bloom this year was due to participation by all members of our community including the staff, board members, parents and the extended community of neighbors and business owners.

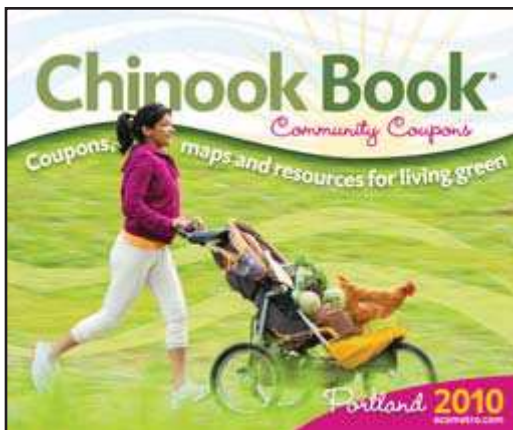

Spring Survey Response

Many of you responded thoughtfully to our annual online parent survey last Spring. Thank You! for taking the time and energy to respond. Your feedback is essential to Trillium's improvement. Stephanie Hinkle (our Director) and James Hindes (Chairman of the Board of Directors) want to let you know how the Board of Directors be using that feedback in 2009-2010.

There were four frequent topics in your comments:

- Trillium's Mission and academic performance: many of you are looking for clearer connections between the Mission and the academic performance of students, teachers, and the school overall. There were many requests for improved visibility of curriculum, learning plans, expected outcomes, and progress against those outcomes.
- Safety: overall, most of you feel your children are safe and that issues can be openly discussed and addressed with staff. This is a significant improvement over responses from a few years ago. Some of you still see opportunities where the school can improve in how it addresses aggressive behavior and bullying.
- Communication: you told us about some things that are working well, and many things that need improvement. Many of the comments encourage communicating sooner and more often. Other highlights include more communication on academics, and more on the role of the Board of Directors.
- Volunteerism: simply put, many of you provided us with some simple suggestions to improve volunteerism.



Briefly, here are the next steps we're planning in the topic areas above:

- Trillium's Mission and academic performance: members of the Board of Directors will lead a dialogue with staff on this topic in November and possibly into December to ensure that the connections do exist and support Trillium's ability to retain and renew its charter. If something more is needed, we'll pursue that. And at minimum, we'll work to improve communication and visibility of those connections and of the school's performance overall.
- Safety: Stephanie and the staff will continue to address safety issues as they arise. If you have specific concerns regarding the individual safety of your child, please discuss it immediately with their advisor or Stephanie (Stephanie@trilliumcharterschool.org).
- Communication: the Board of Directors has reinstated a Communications committee of the Board, effective in late October. More to come on this subject! If you want to be involved or serve on the committee, please check with Jodie Throckmorton (jodie@trilliumcharterschool.org).
- Volunteerism: the Board of Directors will share the collected feedback on this topic with the TFT and support the TFT in improving overall volunteerism.

Thanks again for your responses to the survey, and we look forward to working with as many of you as possible to make improvements (we can't do it on our own)! 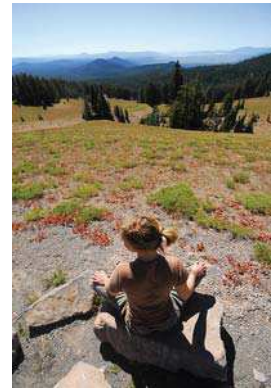
Thanks for Supporting Our School!

AFTERCARE!! By Meg Neal

I arrive at Trillium with a degree in Early Childhood Education from Ohio University, a year of teaching 2nd/3rd grade and two years in a preschool classroom under my belt. I lived in my college town of Athens, Ohio for almost 8 years, teaching, baking, farming and delving into the glorious and nurturing community that Athens is. After a bittersweet good-bye, and some time traveling around our country in between, I moved to Eugene in the early spring of 2008. I spent the year creating yummy pastries for an organic bakery and nannying for a few delightful families along the way. Though I loved Eugene, I did not feel the cozy, gritty, and eccentric vibe I felt when I visited Portland. Summer of 2009, I traveled up and down the Pacific Northwest coast and Cascade range, took a Permaculture Design Course on Orcas Island and found myself moving to sweet, sweet Portland in August. I am more than eager to wiggle and giggle with the kids, staff and community of Trillium. I feel both honored and blessed at the thought of finding such a unique and interesting community.



Thus far, aftercare has been a wonderful experience. From 12-3:15 I am in Polly's Kindergarten classroom with 14 or so five and six year olds. I have structured the day such as an afternoon kindergarten may look. We have lunch, center time (with opportunities to read, write, practice math skills and play freely), outside/gross motor, snack, free choice and books. If you peek your head in you may find us dancing, singing, reading, writing, painting or drawing, baking, making observations and conducting science experiments. The focus on conflict management and non-violent communication is evident and as always, a work in progress.

From 3:15-6 the pace flip flops and I have 1st – 6th graders. We have really been taking advantage of the warm, rain-free weather and I have learned all about dodge ball, girl/boy adolescent dynamics and hilarious jokes, movies and games that entertain 7-12 year olds. I like to have one or two projects in mind for the afternoon, but have found this age to be unbelievably creative and I have taken to following their lead.

There are a few positions available in the early Kindergarten aftercare group and quite a few in the after school group from 3:15-6. SCRIP on the Loose By Juli Maus

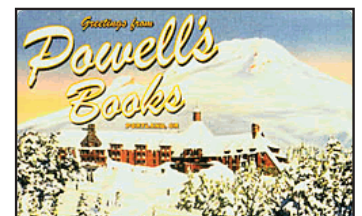

Fundraising Update: October 2009

Greetings Trillium Community,

I'm writing to provide you an update on our fundraising efforts this year, and to ask for your continued financial support of Trillium.

Many of you missed our fundraising letter in the parent packets this fall. Some of you got the letter, but don't know who I am, so let's take care of that first: I'm James, a 4th year Trillium parent of two students, and Chairman of Trillium's Board of Directors. There's a little more information about me on the Trillium website, under the Board biographies. If you spend time at the school, you've probably met my wife Mary Drinkhouse, who volunteers a lot.

Here's the bottom line on why we need to raise more money this year: due to state budget cuts, we have over \$100,000 less to spend than normal. Stephanie Hinkle (the school's Director) and the staff have made a variety of sacrifices and cuts to the budget. We're asking for your help to close a \$30,000 gap in our supplies and facilities budget.

So far, eleven of you have donated anywhere from \$10 to \$5,000; we've collected over \$8,700 so far, which is fantastic! Thank you! Plus, many of you have made much-needed donations of copy paper, which also helps us close the supplies gap. Thanks again!

We still have over \$20,000 to raise. Can you help us? Any amount helps!
