

Now as you excel in everything in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in utmost eagerness, and in our love for you—so we want you to excel also in this generous undertaking.

-2 Corinthians 8: 7

This verse is part of the larger context of 2 Corinthians 8, in which Paul urges the church in Corinth to give generously in support of his ministry to the poor. In this text he harkens back to God's provision of manna for the Hebrew people as they wander the wilderness, writing, "The one who had much did not have too much, and the one who had little did not have too little (vs. 15)." If you remember the story of the manna come down from heaven, you remember that God gave just enough each day, and that any extra they tried to hoard would go bad. The lesson being, you can't store up God's generosity. You can't experience abundant provision in isolation. Abundance, by its very nature, must be shared.

The word "manna" came from the exclamation of the Hebrew people when they saw the heavenly bread. "Manhue?" they asked, which means,

"What is it?" The Israelites, not unlike us, were used to operating from a place of scarcity. They didn't understand abundant, unpredictable, no-strings-attached, generous provision. Sometimes we don't understand it either, but as people of faith we must try, because the gospel message depends on it.

From the beginning of time God establishes all things in abundance, creating an entire diverse beautiful world from nothing and declaring it "good" over and over and over again. And indeed it is good, because God is good—a message that we are called to share with our brothers and sisters in all that we do, which is what Paul is touching on in the eighth chapter of 2 Corinthians. How believers use their resources -- time, money, talents, and attention -- is a reflection of what they believe about God and God's actions in the world. How those resources are used preaches a message to others. Paul wants the Corinthians' actions to be a reflection of the gospel in which they believe.

This stewardship season we are called as people of faith to remember God's goodness in all things, particularly in God's constant faithful provision. God has richly blessed our church this past year through your generosity, and in turn our church has been able to richly bless our community and the worldthrough Coats & More, Little Dresses, Operation InAsMuch, the food pantry, the clothing bank, the backpack program, Two Cents a Meal, the Presbyterian Children's Home of the Highlands, the New **River Community Action emergency** fund, and so many more ministries.

When we excel in generosity, God's love is preached throughout our community and the world more powerfully than any words could ever manage, so together let us pray: Loving God, help us to trust in your daily provision for our lives and for this world. Help us experience your abundance by excelling in generosity, that our lives would witness to your unending love. Amen.



We completed another successful year at the Clothing Bank. The number of clients is steadily growing and every shift is very busy. Three RU students helped throughout the month and volunteers from other churches also helped. Five full weeks makes for a long time to staff each shift. Thank you to all our FPC volunteers and to those who support the Clothing Bank with donations. In 2014, it took 6,000 volunteers hours to keep the Clothing Bank open. There are no paid employees. All the work is done by volunteers from 14 churches and the Board of Directors. It is a wonderful mission project for FPC to be a part of.

FPC IN COMMUNITY

Each month the Mission Committee will ask members in the congregation to share their volunteer activities in the

community. Our church is so loving and gives so much to the community we wanted to let everyone know what is being done for God's children.



Bonnie Sharousky is a member of the Pulaski County Christmas Store. All board members are very active in making Christmas brighter for the children of Pulaski County, who for various reasons would not have

a Christmas experience.

Our season starts early September when we start the application process. As a board member Bonnie takes an active role by interviewing parents to determine if they meet the financial guidelines (food stamps or free lunch eligibility). The PCCS schedules six intakes for the parents to come for a face to face interview. Part of the job description of a board member is to raise money to purchase presents. Every year we have a fund raiser and approach businesses to donate money and/or be a sponsor for this event. Bonnie is very active with this activity.



Bonnie is a working partner in all the activities needed to provide these children with a Merry Christmas. No job is too small or too large. Her generous soul kicks in gear and makes a large contribution to the children of Pulaski County.
