

Waiting and Hoping

When I was a little girl growing up in south side Chicago, my two younger brothers and I walked every Sunday morning to the nearest church to attend Sunday School. During the opening exercises, we would sing: "There's a welcome here, there's a welcome here, there's a Christian welcome here..." When I remember the words and melody, I feel a warmth deep inside. I am mindful of the kindness of Teacher Dolores, the wisdom of Mr. Paul, and the organization of Teacher Irene. They showed such tender love, extraordinary patience, and extravagant generosity. Never once did I hear them lament the fact that my parents did not volunteer or contribute to the life of the church. Never once did I hear them complain about my rambunctiousness and mischief. I looked forward to going; I expected stories and songs, little gifts for memorizing Bible verses, and life savers at Christmas time. Gradually, my landscape of faith, hope and love was planted and nurtured by this remarkable Christian community.

The Advent Season is upon us: a time of waiting and hoping for the coming of Christ—as a babe in the manger, in our hearts and the life of our community of faith, and at the end of the age. God is calling us to feel the Christian welcome embodied in Jesus the Christ, for you and for me, and for the gathered body of seekers and believers. God is calling us to pay attention, and notice the ways Jesus is incarnated for us in one another. God is calling us to step up, and recognize the ways we embody Christ for others within the community of faith and out in the world.

Like Mary and Joseph making the journey to Bethlehem, carrying the Christ child, we are embarking on our own journey to Bethlehem. We know where we are headed—and we know the way. We do not know what we will encounter along the way... blue skies or clouds, well-worn paths or new trails, friends or foes... but we do know this: God is with us. Emmanuel—"God-with-us" lights the path before us, walks beside us unfolding the Word of truth, and dwells within us, carrying our burdens for us.

I am so glad to be with you, and to walk this journey of faith together.



Resolution Adopted by the Michigan Conference "Proclaim Release to the Captives"

WHEREAS: the United States has the highest rate of incarceration in the world, 6 to 10 times greater than other industrialized nations, even surpassing repressive regimes like Russia, China, and Iran;

AND WHEREAS: rates of incarceration in the U.S. have quintupled in the past 40 years, with persons of color, especially black men, jailed in vastly disproportionate numbers, more than half for non-violent crimes, and receiving much longer sentences than white persons for the same offenses;

AND WHEREAS: the so-called "War on Drugs" has become the primary mechanism for a vast pervasive system of racialized social control: while a majority of illegal drug users are white, three-quarters of people imprisoned for drug use are persons of color;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that we the Michigan Conference, United Church of Christ, in the Spirit of Jesus who proclaims "Release to the captives and recovery of Sight to the blind," and says that the way we treat prisoners is the way we treat him, express to all elected officials in our Communities, Counties, State and Nation our pro found concern and moral outrage regarding this unjust system of mass incarceration.;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the Prophetic Integrity Mission Area Team and the Associations work to educate the people and congregations of the Conference, and lead them into advocacy to dramatically change this unjust system at all levels of our society;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that we support all activities that would achieve racial justice in criminal sentencing; provide treatment rather than incarceration For non-violent drug offenders and those with mental illness; support re-entry services for ex-offenders; implement restorative justice principles in all possible circumstances, especially within the juvenile justice system; and also prohibit privatization of Michigan's prison system.
