INSTRUCTIONS

Vermont U.S. Veteran designator to be placed on any license or Non-Driver ID may be obtained by any honorably discharged veteran or a veteran discharged under honorable conditions.

The term 'VETERAN' will be placed on the face of the License or non-driver Identification Card.

The Veteran designator will be reprinted on the license and non-driver ID at every license renewal.

Submit your application to the Vermont Office of Veterans Affairs for certification as a U. S. Veteran after section 1 is complete. If mailed the Office of Veterans Affairs will mail the completed application back to you.

- Veteran applicants must submit a copy of their DD Form 214, Report of Separation, to the Office of Veterans Affairs
- If this is a new registration or a transfer of a registration, form TA-VD-119, Vermont Registration, Tax & Title Application must also be submitted.
- If this application is for a U.S. Veteran Disabled Plate the Universal Medical Evaluation/Progress Report, form TA-VS-113, must accompany this application, unless a medical has been filed with the DMV within the last four years.

Please submit this completed application along with your renewal notice, required fees (if applicable), and any other required forms.

Faxed copies will be accepted as long as they contain the required certified stamp and authorized signature.

SECTION 1

Please provide all requested personal identification information. Select the plate type that you are requesting. Check the box on the bottom right side of Section 1 if application is being made as the surviving spouse of a previous holder of a Vermont Veteran's license plate. If the address indicated is different than our records we will consider this a notification of change of mailing address for all your records.

Sign and date the application. **Your signature is required for your application to be processed.**

SECTION 2

When Section 1 has been completed mail or bring this form to the Vermont Office of Veterans Affairs for certification of veteran status. **Vermont Office of Veterans Affairs, 118 State St., Montpelier, VT 05620-4401.**

NOTE: *To ensure your application is processed quickly and accurately, please include a copy of your DD Form 214, Report of Separation (for veteran applicants) when submitting this form to the Office of Veterans Affairs. The Office of Veterans Affairs maintains DD Form 214s on many veterans in Vermont, but if your record is not in their files they will request a copy to be provided, which will delay your approval. After your eligibility has been verified, the Office of Veterans Affairs will sign and stamp your forms. Your form will then be ready for submission to the DMV.*

Applications submitted without certification by the Vermont Office of Veterans Affairs or the signature of the applicant will be returned to the applicant.

The Office of Veterans Affairs will return the completed application with Veteran certification back to you. Once you have received the returned application that you may bring this application to a DMV office or mail the application to the DMV. If at the time of renewal you will need to include any other required paperwork for your license renewal.
