Oaths, Affidavits and Statutory Declarations Act 2005

This Statutory Declaration is to be completed only for the renewal of a Western Australian driver's licence when the applicant cannot produce one of the acceptable forms of primary identification (please see overleaf for acceptable forms of identification for the renewal of a Western Australian driver's licence). Applicants must also provide one form of secondary identification.

This Declaration is to be completed by a referee who:

- has known the applicant for a period of 12 months or more;
- is not a relative of the applicant; and
- can provide one form of primary identification.

Or, any person before whom, under the *Statutory Declarations Act 1959* of the Commonwealth, a statutory declaration may be made.

Primary Identification

(Originals or certified copies only)

- An Australian passport (which has not expired for more than two years)
- A current Document of Identity issued by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade
- A current overseas passport
- An Australian citizenship or naturalisation document or immigration papers issued by the Department of Immigration and Border protection
- An original or certified copy of a birth certificate (not an extract)
- A photo identity card for police or defence force personnel (excluding civilian identity cards)
- A consular photo identity card issued by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade
- A photographic licence issued by an Australian driver licensing authority (which has not expired for more than two years)
- A Western Australian Proof of Age card (not an 18+ card)

Secondary Identification

(Originals)

- A State or Commonwealth Government employee photo identity card
- A current entitlement card issued by a Commonwealth Government Department (eg, a Medicare card)
- A current credit card or ATM card from a financial institution
- A passbook or account statement from a financial institution not more than 12 months old
- A telephone, gas or electricity account not more than 12 months old
- A water or local rates notice or land valuation notice not more than two years old
- An electoral enrolment card or other evidence of enrolment not more than two years old
- Armed Services discharge papers not more than 12 months old
- A certificate or statement of accomplishment or enrolment from a recognised educational institution
- A letter, not more than 12 months old, from the principal of a recognised educational institution
