

## English II Syllabus 2015-2016 Academic School Year

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The Language Arts department of Sharyland Pioneer High School challenges all student learners to excel in the areas of reading, writing, and advanced critical thinking. In addition special emphasis is placed on enriched college preparation and readiness, mastery of the state's E.O.C (STAAR) examination, and improvement of SAT and ACT scores.

**Course Description:** English II is the study of World Literature. The course includes intense study of the elements of writing: rhetorical devices, voice, stylistic devices, grammar; the elements of literature: diction, language, imagery, syntax. The objective of English II is concise writing, coherent critical thinking, and mastery of all TEKS. It is designed to prepare students for the demands of college degree programs and/or for the workplace.

#### **Electronic Devices:**



Sharyland Pioneer High School implements a BYOD (bring your own device) policy. When given permission, students will be allowed to use electronic devices for educational purposes *only*. As per the Sharyland ISD handbook:

- 1st violation = 24 hour confiscation, parent must pick up device and pay \$15 fine.
- 2nd violation = 48 hour confiscation, parent must pick up device and pay \$15 fine.
- 3rd violation = confiscation until last day of school (no exceptions).

\* Pick up times are 3:30 PM - 4:30 PM.

# Make up Work/Late Work/Retests (As per Sharyland ISD handbook):

Students with an excused absence from school (including off-campus suspension) will have the opportunity to make up missed work at the rate of *one day for one day missed*, with a *maximum of five days*. Students who are absent but had prior notice of a major or minor assignment must complete the assignment on the first day back to school. Student will receive a *zero* for any major or minor assignment not made up within the allotted time.

Students with an unexcused absence may not make up missed work; however, if the unexcused absence is determined to be caused by an extenuating circumstance, makeup work may be allowed. The grade for the makeup work will be no higher than a 70.

All students will be given 3 additional days to make up a major assignment if late (with a progressive grade penalty of 10 points per day). All students will be given up to 3 additional school days to redo a failing major assignment, but the grade will be no higher than a 70.
