Dear CUESTE Applicant,

Thank you for your interest, in our CUESTE (Curriculum for Undergraduate Elementary School Teacher Education) undergraduate teacher education program here at Eastern Oregon University. The faculty believes that it offers a high quality experience both in campus-based courses and in field experiences.

Because of the program's excellence, many students apply for admission each year. Admission to CUESTE is a process that requires multiple forms of evidence that document your eligibility for the program. To be competitive in this process, you need to become fully aware of the qualifications and procedures that will help you present yourself at your best.

In any one cycle of admission to the CUESTE program, there may be space limitations at a particular site. Therefore, simply meeting eligibility requirements does not guarantee admission to the program. Students who have successfully met all admission criteria and submitted their applications by the deadline will be given first consideration.

Admission Decisions:

After your materials are reviewed, you will receive a letter informing you of the next step in the process. The letter should arrive about one month after the application due date. Those not meeting eligibility requirements will be advised about what additional steps may be necessary to become eligible.

Students who meet the requirements for CUESTE program admission will be assigned a program location depending on space available at the student's site preference. If there are more qualified applicants than available space for any particular site, first preference will be given to those individuals who bring the strongest academic, experiential or diverse cultural experience to the program. Students who qualify for admission but are not assigned to their first site preference will be offered placement at one of the other sites (Coos Bay, Gresham, La Grande, Ontario, and Pendleton).

The education faculty believes that becoming a teacher requires a serious commitment; thus, the process is meant to introduce candidates to high standards and to ensure quality in the teacher candidates for the CUESTE program. For success, read the Advising Guide and Admissions Packet materials thoroughly, adhere to all the requirements, prepare your documents carefully, and meet all the deadlines.

As Admissions Coordinators, we are available to assist you, as is your education advisor. Please do not hesitate to contact one of us.

To be eligible to apply for admission, you must answer "yes" to all the following questions.

- 1. Can you reasonably expect to complete degree and program requirements within 2 years?
- 2. Are you currently enrolled in, or have completed, ED 242 or its equivalent (equivalent courses include ED 200) Exceptions may be made in Ontario due to course scheduling.
- 3. Have you completed and verified 30 hours of experience with elementary age students in a school or similar setting?
- 4. Have you taken and **passed** one of the following basic competency tests: **EAS** (Essential Academic Skills), **CBEST** or **Praxis PPST**? <u>http://www.orela.nesinc.com</u>, <u>http://www.obest.nesinc.com</u> or <u>http://www.ets.org/praxis</u>,
- 5. Do you have a minimum calculated GPA of 2.75 or greater in your multidisciplinary studies coursework? GPA is based on MDST check sheet data.

To establish eligibility:

Submit all required information to the College of Education Office **no later than 5:00 PM on March 11, 2013**. Detailed directions for each of the admissions requirements are provided below.

Admissions Requirements

- <u>EOU Application Form</u>: If you are not already an admitted student at Eastern Oregon University, <u>submit an</u> <u>application for university admission to EOU's admissions department prior to submitting CUESTE</u> <u>program application</u>. Applications are located on the web at <u>http://www.eou.edu/admissions/</u>. Official transcripts from all of the colleges and universities you have attended are required for <u>admission to EOU</u>.
- 2. <u>CUESTE Application Form</u>: The Application Form is in this packet. Fill it out completely and legibly. Please include current and summer contact information. Notify Megan Caldwell (541-962-3411 or <u>mcaldwell@eou.edu</u>) in the Education Office if any of your contact information changes.
- 3. Personal Introduction/Experience with Children: This letter serves two purposes: 1) to introduce you to the education faculty, telling about your interests and goals; and 2) to provide information regarding your experience with children. In the personal introduction, describe why you want to be a teacher. Include relevant personal background information, as well as how your background and interests will help you as a future teacher. In stating your prior experience with children, describe the volunteer, practicum, and/or employment situation where you worked with children. Include how these specific experiences have given you a greater understanding of the rewards and challenges of working with children, thus making you a good candidate for a teacher-preparation program. You must have a minimum of 30 hours of experience1 working with elementary-aged children occurring after high school graduation and within the past three years. Your personal introduction should be word-processed and no more than three typed pages. Be advised: spelling and grammatical errors will be taken into consideration.
- * ¹ Babysitting and working with a family member are not acceptable as the only prior experience with children
- 4. <u>Resume:</u> Please provide a one-page professional resume, which highlights your Career Objectives, Education, Professional Experience, and Other Activities. Some districts or schools may require this when placing students, so the College of Education will have this on file and may distribute it for placement purposes. Please initial the statement on the check sheet (p. 4) providing permission to the College of Education to use your resume accordingly.
- 5. <u>Diversity Essay:</u> Please respond to the following prompt by submitting a1-2 page, typed, double-spaced essay. Classrooms today are filled with students of diverse backgrounds, varied ability levels, and wide ranges of experiences. Discuss any personal attributes and experience you bring that can enrich the teaching community to meet the needs of students of diverse backgrounds. Highlight any special skills, knowledge, or experiences you have that would contribute to meeting the needs of the changing demographics of K-12 students. Examples of such attributes, skills, or experiences that may be included: being from a group underrepresented in teaching; interest or expertise in a field where there is a teaching shortage; expertise in more than one language; or having diverse cultural experiences (through public service, living in varied environments, travel). Think about where you have lived and where you have worked (paid and unpaid work) over your life, and weave in descriptions of experiences that you have had that have helped prepare you to understand diversity in ethnicity, culture, language, age, physical or cognitive ability, multiple socioeconomic levels, or community (urban, rural, suburban).
- 6. <u>CUESTE Program Planning Form</u>: The form is in this packet. Your advisor will list all courses (prefix, number, title and credits) that are necessary to complete all degree and program requirements. Only the form signed by your advisor will be accepted.
- <u>Transcripts:</u> For admission to the CUESTE program, you must obtain <u>unofficial transcripts</u> from ALL colleges and universities you have attended. At Eastern, there is no charge for unofficial transcripts. <u>Printouts from Webster</u> (EOU's online transcript) are not acceptable.
- 8. <u>Multidisciplinary Degree Program Major Check Sheet</u>: Submit an updated Multidisciplinary Studies check sheet, available from your advisor. The multidisciplinary degree checklist should include courses taken for your minor or course of study. <u>The calculated MDST coursework GPA must be 2.75 or higher to be considered for program admission.</u> You must have grades of "C-" or better in all required courses (except ED 242 or equivalent, which requires a "B-" or better). The multidisciplinary degree check sheet will be used to establish eligibility as well as to demonstrate planned completion of the multidisciplinary degree.

- Academic Minor (or Course of Study) Check Sheet: All Elementary Education majors are required to have a specialty focus or an approved course of study (e.g. Mathematical studies, Reading or ESOL). Work with your advisor to obtain and complete the appropriate checklist. Individual courses of study need to have signatures of approval **prior** to submitting the application for admission.
- 10. <u>Basic Skills Exam scores:</u> <u>http://www.orela.nesinc.com</u>, <u>http://www.cbest.nesinc.com/</u> or <u>http://www.ets.org/praxis</u> You are required to take and pass a basic skills exam before you can be admitted to the program. Please refer to the ORELA website under Essential Academic Skills (EAS), or the CBEST or PPST web sites for complete testing information. <u>Make a photocopy of your official test score report form</u> and include with your application. Do not submit originals. <u>Even if you requested that the testing company send your scores to Eastern, you must submit a</u> <u>PHOTOCOPY</u> of your *individual scores* with your application! If you do not have a copy of your scores, request them from the testing company.
- 11. Letters of recommendation/reference: the same individual cannot write both of the required letters.
 - a. <u>Letter of Reference:</u> Please obtain a letter of reference from the supervising individual of your required minimum 30 hours of experience with children. If you cannot obtain this reference, seek assistance from an education advisor. You may have the person mail (provide a stamped addressed envelope) or email the letter directly to the College of Education at <u>ed@eou.edu</u> attn: CUESTE Support Specialist. You may also include the letter with the material you submit. Faxes are not acceptable documents.
 - b. Letter of Recommendation: Additionally, please submit a general letter of recommendation from an individual who is in a position to attest to your positive character and potential as a classroom teacher. If desired, you may use the recommendation form included in the Admissions Packet, however the individual will also need to include a written statement in addition to the ratings page. Please put your name on the recommendation form before giving it to your reference to complete. The person who writes this letter should be able to describe your professional qualities. A professor, employer, community member, or former teacher would be a good choice. Family members and other college students are *not acceptable* references. You may have the person mail (provide a stamped addressed envelope) or email the letter directly to the College of Education at ed@eou.edu attn: CUESTE Support Specialist. You may also include the letter with the material you submit. Faxes are not acceptable documents.
- 12. <u>Character Questions:</u> Please complete and sign the character question form (provided within this packet). Answer all questions truthfully. If you must answer "YES" to any question, you must provide copies of *official court documents* and a *personal written statement of the incident*. We will work with EOU's licensure officer and TSPC to determine your eligibility for program admission.

When you have the required items completed, put them in a manila envelope in the order listed above. Keep a copy of all the documents for your records. You may hand deliver them to the College of Education office in Zabel Hall 255 or mail them to:
