Weekly Reflections



On February 2002

The room where I was sitting was about twice the size of the sacristy at Sacred Heart. The south window allowed the sun to shine onto the middle of the floor. I faced a priest, who was sitting at his desk across the room with his chair turned toward me. As we were visiting, I looked to the west at the snow packed Rocky Mountains, which were less than twenty miles away. The priest, Msgr. Leo Horrigan, the pastor of Notre Dame Catholic Church in Denver, and I, the associate pastor at the same parish, were having a morning meeting to discuss how things were going for me. I had just started my assignment a few weeks earlier at this parish in the southwest area of Denver.

Monsignor and I were discussing a variety of things, including the devastating event five months earlier, which was the September 11th attacks. While that tragic day undoubtedly touched all United States citizens, another situation had an unfathomable effect on the life of the Catholic Church in the USA, and later across the whole world. It had happened on Sunday, January 6th, approximately five weeks before our conversation took place. Fourteen years have passed, yet the news story continues to impact my life as a priest, and all of us who belong to the Catholic Church. Never would I have guessed the significance of the front-page story in the Boston Globe Sunday edition on January 6th. As a Catholic priest, the news account about the Archdiocese of Boston in many ways parallels and shapes my daily life as much as the terrorist attacks on September 11th.


While the Monsignor and I were chatting about that Catholic Archdiocese out East and the Boston Globe account of the priest's sexual abuse within the Archdiocese, I became overwhelmed with emotion. In front of the Monsignor looking him in his eyes, tears began to fall down from my face as I wept. I remember that day plainly as if it happened today. I am not certain why I was weeping, at that moment perhaps for a lot of reasons: the hurt felt by the many boys and girls abused by priests, the priests who gravely sinned, the Bishops and other high authorities in the church covering up the abuse, and the shame I felt at that time as a priest. And there I sat in silence, crying, while my pastor only looked at me. After a while, I left his office and went downstairs to my own office.

Although I have known priests from our Archdiocese who have abused children, I only knew them through meetings and gatherings. Never have I had direct experience with sexual abuse in or outside the Church, except for one, only one instance. That case happened between family members at another diocese that I once served in. Nonetheless, the priest sexual abuse weighs heavy on my mind particularly, as it deeply affects my ministry as a Catholic priest. To be continued...
