The university continues to evolve, as do our experiences as alumni. Our class headquarters and housing will be in Carl Becker House, one of the new West Campus residences that are entirely air-conditioned. Reunion registrants can request placement in singles, doubles, or suites. Breakfast and light refreshments will be offered daily in the dining room and lounge with adjacent tent. Becker is quite an "upgrade" from the U-Halls, and there will be shuttle buses when you don't walk up Libe Slope.

The class activity schedule outlines university and class activities. While it looks very full, it's your choice whether to explore campus and the area on your own terms or to take advantage of the scheduled programming. Your registration fee covers food and drink during your stay as well as services and attractions that include class shuttle buses and tent parties.

We are excited about the venues and menus for our class activities, which will accommodate the large attendance

we hope to have. Casual attire with comfortable shoes is recommended. Other special features include learning how some '79ers are influencing Cornell, including Seth Klarman and his support of the new humanities building, and Marc Keane who designed the Rebecca Q. and James C. ## **Package FAQs**

#### What else does the registration fee include?

Most packages include class receptions and meals, souvenirs, class shuttles, tent parties, headquarters snacks and beverages, and most university events.

#### What is NOT included?

The university Kids Club (formerly known as the university Youth Program), Ithaca Childcare Program (IC3), some athletic events, concerts, and the optional events listed on your registration form.

#### What if I register and then can't come?

We are happy to offer refunds if you cancel before May 23.

#### Can I register when I get there?

Yes, you can—but please consider that it's much easier on your class Reunion planners if you sign up beforehand so they order enough food and beverages for the weekend.

## **Housing FAQs**

#### What's included in the room fee?

The university provides bath towels, bed linens, hangers, broadband Internet, and a daily towel exchange. You'll want to bring your own radio, alarm clock, hair dryer, and iron. Carl Becker is one of the only residence halls that is entirely air-conditioned in both guest rooms and common spaces. A limited number of porta-cribs will be provided. We recommend you bring your own if needed.

#### When is check in/check out?

Thursday at noon/Sunday by noon

#### Can I smoke in the residence halls or bring my pet?

No, you may not smoke, and only service animals are welcome.

#### Can I get a room near my friends?

If you wish to room near or with a specific party or parties, please note this when completing the housing section of your Reunion registration. The person you request on your housing registration must also request you. We will try our best to accommodate all special requests for housing. We will need to give priority to those who are staying for a minimum of two nights. This will be done on a first come, first serve basis.

I have special medical or mobility needs—is it practical for me to stay in the residence halls? Yes! To communicate specific medical or mobility needs, please contact your class registration chair by May 23.

#### Are there hotel rooms available in Ithaca during Reunion?

A limited number of rooms in several hotels have been blocked for Alumni returning to Cornell. Please keep in mind that availability may be limited at this point. Review the hotel information on the Cornell Reunion website, and call your favorite hotel directly for a reservation on a first-come, first served basis. Be sure to ask for the Reunion block.
