#### Al-Noor's Scores - Hitting a Homerun

Our 2007-2008 CAT test results were very encouraging! From Pre-K through 12<sup>th</sup> Grade, our students scored in the top 25% nationwide. Individual scores from spring 2008 were sent home. Grade level scores are posted in the school. This is a great achievement for both schools, masha'Allah, and we hope to be in the 80<sup>th</sup> percentile next year!



In addition, our juniors took the PSATs this fall. Masha'Allah, the five students' scores averaged in 67<sup>th</sup> percentile. This means that they scored better than 67% of students nationwide (including all private and public school students whom took the PSATs this fall.) We have room to improve, but this is a very encouraging sign. Students are performing even better on SATs with scores over 2000!

Over all there are some wonderful achievements at ANA to report. Share the good news with the community! We should be humble in our achievements, but we should also let everyone know what we can offer!
