Hiking Elkmont Nature, Sugarland Mountain, Huskey Gap & Little River Trails August 12, 2006 By Tom Cressler

The hike will start at the Elkmont Nature trailhead for about 1.3 miles to the Sugarland Mountain trail gaining about 350 feet. From there we will hike about 1.8 miles to the Huskey Gap trail gaining about 650 feet and then down Huskey Gap trail for about 2.1 miles to the Little River trail, losing about 500 feet. From there it is 3.0 miles down the Little River trail to our vehicles losing about 500 feet. The hike difficulty is rated mostly easy. We will meet in the Central Baptist Church of Bearden parking lot for car-pooling and <u>leave</u> at 8:30 am and stop



at Hardee's in Maryville, on the way to the park, about 9:00 am for those who would prefer to meet there. We recommend shoes to wear to and from the hike plus sturdy hiking shoes, a snack, something to drink and a camera. After the hike plan on stopping on the way back for a meal and refreshments.

Knoxville Ski & Outing Club 2007 Distant Ski Trips

The Distant Trips Committee has finalized the Agenda for the 2007 Ski Season. The committee put an agenda in place based on input from the membership, trip cost, available flights out of Knoxville, and competitive offers. We hope it meets with Clubs approval.

To insure a space on any of the trips we will accept pre-sign up night deposits August 1. No deposits will be accepted prior to August 1, and spaces will be allocated on a first come first serve bases. If we receive more deposits than we have spaces, then names will be listed by lottery drawing, with spouses and significant other given priority.

Pre-sign up night deposits should be sent to the Trip Captain and questions concerning the trip directed to the Trip Captain. Should a trip not have a Trip Captain assigned by August 1, send the deposit to the KSOC post office box with the envelope annotated with Trip Name on the out side.

The following is the agenda with Trip Captains, dates, trip cost, pre-sign up night deposit required and spaces available. Trip Captains will be publishing information articles in the Fall-Line prior to the trip.

- Park City; Trip Captain Chuck Sine. January 13-19. Cost \$860.00, pre-sign up deposit \$150.00, with 40 spaces available.
- Zermatt, Switzerland; Trip Captain Jerry Eisele. February 2-13, Cost approx \$2400.00 (may vary a few dollars depending on final international departure taxes), pre-sign up deposit \$250.00, with 42 spaces available. Trip cost includes 3 days in London after Zermatt.
- Banff/Lake Louise, Canada; Trip Captain Carol Waldbauer. February 3-10, Cost \$1200.00, pre-sign up deposit \$150.00, with 32 spaces available.
- Panorama, Canada; Trip Captain Brian Southard. February 24-March 3, Cost \$1250.00 includes 5 day lift tickets, optional heli-skiing. Pre-sign up deposit \$150.00, with 32 spaces available.
- Sun Valley; Trip Captain Kerry Waldbauer. March 3-10, Cost \$1210.00, <u>includes 5 day lift tickets</u>, pre-sign up deposit \$150.00, with 32 spaces available.
- Aspen; Trip Captain David Kerr. March 17-24, Cost \$1100.00 (Adults), \$595 (Child), pre-sign up deposit \$150.00, with 33 spaces available. This is a Spring Break trip.

The annual Snowshoe, WV trip this coming season is January 5-8, 2007. We will depart Knoxville via charter motor coach at 3:00 PM on Friday, arriving at Snowshoe about 11:00 PM. We will depart Snowshoe on Monday at 3:00 PM, arriving in Knoxville about 11:00 PM. This trip coincides with the Crescent race weekend at Silver Creek.

The price of the trip is dependent upon type of lodging desired and final cost of the charter motor coach. We will beoffering lodging at South Mountain 2 & 3 bedroom bronze units (Treetops) and in the Village 2 & 3 bedroom platinum units (Allegheny Springs). At this time we do not have a firm quote on the motor coach, so the pricing listed is that of last year. This coming year should be in the same ballpark.

The January 2006 trip was Allegheny Springs \$375 or Treetops \$240 per person.

Zermatt – Your Dream Ski Trip February 2-13, 2007

Dominated by Switzerland's most famous landmark the Matterhorn—Zermatt is certainly the "Ski Trip" you dreamed of. Well, now that dream can come true. You can be one of 42 KSOC'ers to experience one of the best, if not <u>the</u> best ski resort in the world. Partly thanks to the sublime beauty of the Matterhorn, but also thanks to the absence of cars and the resort's great sense of tradition, Zermatt has that special, alluring atmosphere which draws one back time and time again.

Skiing Zermatt is an experience you will never forget. Being surrounded by 29 peaks over 4000M (that's 13,100 ft.) just takes your breath away. And, yes, these are the highest mountains in Europe! No matter where you are the Matterhorn is almost always in sight. As you ride up on a tram (there are 17 aerial cable cars/ trams) you will soar across chasms and up cliff faces suspended thousands of feet above the snow. Make sure to take your camera with you, for these are postcard photo opportunities.

But the dream will come true when you snap on your skis and head down the mountain. That's when it all becomes real. No longer are you just in awe of the mountain and its surroundings, you are part of it—You Are Here to Ski!

You'll have to wait for the next newsletter to learn more about your dream ski trip. But just to tantalize you, here are some quick additional facts: (1) all "three" of Zermatt's ski areas soar to at least 3100M (that's 10,200 ft.), (2) the longest run is 13km (about 8 miles) to the village, and (3) you can ski over to Cervinia, Italy.

After leaving Zermatt we will spend three days in London sightseeing and enjoying this historic city before coming home. Just a few more important details, we will be leaving February 2, 2007 and returning on February 13th. We have only 42 spaces on this trip so you need to act fast to make your ski dream come true. The cost of the trip is \$2,400.00 which includes round trip air, all transfers, daily breakfast and four-star dinner in Zermatt, daily breakfast only in London, and all those extra taxes everyone complains about. Banff, Canada February 3-10, 2007

What an elegant trip this will be! And what magnificent scenery! With 3 different ski areas having the looks of the Alps and the chance to stay at two of the premier hotels in the world, this will surely be a trip to remember for a long time. We have a fantastic trip package that includes 4 nights at the world famous and romantic Banff Springs Hotel and then 3 nights at the beautiful Fairmount Chateau Lake Louise (in the summer, their rooms go for \$400 per night). The Chateau is called "Diamond in the Wilderness" and features some of the most spectacular views imaginable. Where majestic mountains are reflected in the picturesque glacier fed Lake Louise! Panorama Ski Resort Canadian Rockies February 24 – March 3, 2007

Come ski Panorama Mountain this coming winter season!! It is one of the best value ski trips the Knoxville Ski Club has to offer.

Panorama is located on the edge of the famous Bugaboos in British Columbia's Purcell Mountains. Panorama's ski mountain offers over 2,847 patrolled acres, over 4,000 vertical feet and over 120 trails with bowls, extreme zone, terrain parks and half pipes. It is serviced by 9 ski lifts, including two new quads in 2006. The terrain is broken down into 20 percent beginner, 55 percent intermediate/advanced and 25 percent expert. It is ranked third highest in North America.

We will stay at Gold slope side condos which are located in the center of the Panorama village. Other optional activities are ice fishing, snowmobiling, snow shoeing, cross country skiing, heli-skiing and much more. There is even an option to ski one day at nearby Kicking Horse resort. 32 lucky skiers will be able to experience this trip.

The price of the trip for 6 days 7 nights, roundtrip airfare, ground transfers in Calgary and a 5 day lift ticket for \$1250. This is probably a first where the price of the trip includes the lift tickets.
