Cruisin' News

We are happy to report that the March cruise was a great success. Nine boats made it to Gulfport and had a great time. Ed and Betty Burton came a day ahead and were waiting for us. We had Happy Hour on their boat. It was quite a crowd and included 3 dogs. Free Spirit, Avalanche, Tranquility, Run-

ning Tide, Spring Fever, JLUA, Asante Mungo, Remedy, and Sassy were all there. Some of use knew the short cut across Boca Ciega Bay and some did not. Asante Mungo had some serious challenges at the bridge to Boca Ciega Bay since the mast was only about a foot and a half lower than the bridge at low tide. Marino carefully timed his arrival and departure for low tide

when he was at the bridge. Adelia and I as well as all aboard Asante Mungo breathed a sigh of relief when they passed safely under the bridge.

We had a strong and constant wind from the South. Ed and Betty re-anchored after they found them-

selves too close to the dock, but I did not see anyone get into trouble. Pia Trattoria Italian Restaurant was our first choice, but they were all booked up so we went to the Neptune Grill

Sunday the wind was still from the South and was about 25 knots and above when we crossed Tampa Bay and guess what di-

rection it was coming from. You guessed it, on the nose. Adelia and I barely made it across Tampa Bay by going full throttle all the way at about 1 to 2 knots. We heard that Sassy had to spend some time anchored at the Cross to wait for the wind to die down so they could make

in on a few songs during the lively karaoke session. It felt more like a party than just going out for dinner. Thanks for joining me on this fun evening.



The Marietta Museum of Art and Whimsy April 14th

You might have noticed as you drive south on Tamiami Trail towards Sarasota that the Purple Cow (better known as Van Wezel Performing Arts Theatre) has some competition. There are a couple of 1200 pound giant shocking pink flamingos roaming around the streets. They hang out in the gardens of our next outing, The Marietta Museum of Art and Whimsy located at 2121 N. Tamiami Trail, Sarasota. The museum is in its 6th season and boasts a Neverland-esque atmosphere, lush gardens and features the collected works of contemporary artists. Named after the founder, curator, philanthropist and artist, Marietta Lee, who graduated herself from Ringling Col-

lege of Art and Design, reports that the mission statement here is to put smiles on faces. The story began 30 years ago in Kentucky when Marietta, a nurse, attended the scene of a tragic plane crash with no



survivors. It changed her life. She wanted to create art that would help cope with life

situations. She moved to Sarasota in 1984 and earned her art degree. After trying to

accomplish her goal elsewhere with no success, Marietta came back to Sarasota and created this artistic sanctuary. Inside the charming pink building is a series of artwork by humorous creative talent displayed in every

nook and cranny of the structure and garden areas. (Note: there are over 160 lawn flamingos that reside on the property, if you care to count.) A docent will take us for a private tour at 2 P.M. and give us some insight into the conception of this unusual museum.
