Will spring come early this year? According to groundhog Punxsutawney Phil, an early spring is on its way. With the current temperatures forecasted this week, it feels like six more weeks of winter weather is on the way. Alpha 6 students and teachers spent Tuesday in Montpelier for a first-hand look at how our government works. Upon entering the State House, they were greeted by Representative Mike Yantachka, and escorted up to the gallery to observe the House of Representatives in session. It was pretty exciting when they were introduced and asked to stand to a round of applause. During the day, groups of students participated in a mock Supreme Court trial, and were given a tour of the State House. This trip was a culminating activity for their study of the U.S. Constitution and the Bill of Rights. In preparation for their visit, students learned how a bill becomes a law. They also became familiar with the Vermont State Government's website, and have been following all of the bills introduced so far this session. Students chose a bill that sparked their interest, and wrote a letter to their Representa-

tive either in favor or in opposition of the bill. Special thanks to parent chaperones, Mandy Koskinen and Tracy Burhans for helping to make this trip a memorable experience for all!

Charlotte Essential Early Education Program Application

The Charlotte Essential Early Education Program is now accepting applications for a random drawing for community peers for the 2013-14 school year. Our preschool is a 5 STAR accredited licensed early education program that provides a play-based, developmentally appropriate environment for all children. Our curriculum is based on the Vermont Early Learning Standards (VELS) and Creative Curriculum/TSGold. We believe that a diverse classroom offers opportunities for adults and children to practice acceptance and compassion and also provides a broad range of learning experiences.

Our program is designed for 3, 4 and 5 year old children with developmental delays and community peers who reside in Charlotte. The program follows the Charlotte Central School calendar and students are able to utilize the Charlotte Central School buses for transportation in the morning. Parents may be responsible for transportation at dismissal.

Peers who will be age 4 by September 1, 2013 are eligible for the Monday, Wednesday, Friday program. Classes are held from 8:05-12:00. Peers who will be age 3 by September 1, 2013 are eligible for the Tuesday, Thursday program and classes are held from 8:05-11:00 a.m.




Applications must be received by February 8, 2013. Students will be selected via a lottery and parents will be notified the week of February 25, 2013.
