DIRECTOR'S NOTES

The Drowsy Chaperone's origins are the makings of modern musical legend. It was actually conceived as a wedding gift for Second City performers Bob Martin and Janet Van De Graaff. They asked Lisa Lambert, songwriter and best friend, to be a best man at their wedding. As is the duty of every best man, Ms. Lambert was reluctant to organize a stripper-laden bachelor party, so instead she enlisted Don McKellar, Greg Morrison and a team of theatrically minded colleagues to create and perform a 40-minute original musical called *The Drowsy Chaperone*. She named the lead characters 'Bob Martin' and 'Janet Van De Graaff' (the show's bride and groom).

There is hardly anything of the real Bob and Janet in the show, as their cohorts endeavored to have it be as little about their friends as possible. The point was to bring all of them together to perform a pastiche of the 1920s musicals they all loved. After the presentation, Bob Martin joined his cast of friends on stage and, now famously, quipped: "What a wonderful show. I have some notes." Mr. Martin said, "I knew when we were watching it in 1998, at my wedding party, that there was something about the exuberance of a 1920s musical." Those notes would be the beginnings of the "Man in Chair," the character who comments on the action of what would become *The Drowsy Chaperone*. Mr. Martin, who would play "Man in Chair", "realized the value of having a very human, recognizable iconic character, who presents the audience's perspective on what we were watching, which would allow us to comment on it, to deconstruct it. Sort of a more post-modern approach."

But selling the show to potential producers had one major roadblock: No one would read it because of its title. Producer Kevin McCollum put it, "I would never produce a show called *The Drowsy Chaperone*!" The creators were open to changing the title. Finally, they took matters into their own hands and produced a stage reading in New York. Mr. McCollum immediately jumped on board and said we'll fix the title later.

Eight years after its premiere at Bob & Janet's wedding reception, *The Drowsy Chaperone* opened at The Marquis Theatre on Broadway and was nominated for 13 Tonys winning 5 including one for Mr. Martin (book) and best man Lisa Lambert (music & lyrics).

As for producer McCollum, he has often said: "A musical should start on the earth and end in the heavens." "And one more thing," he added, "the title is perfect."



Food and beverages are not permitted inside the auditorium.

McGinnis Theatre is accessible to the handicapped. Handicapped parking spaces are provided in all parking lots. An elevator is located on the west side of the building. Wheelchairs may be accommodated in both the upper and lower auditorium. Please mention the need for a wheelchair location when purchasing tickets. Assisted-listening devices may be borrowed at no cost and are available from the house manager.

Restrooms are located on the lower level and may be reached via the stairs off the main lobby or via the elevator.

Refreshments are available in the lobby during intermission. Proceeds benefit the East Carolina Theatre Foundation.



A NOTE ABOUT THEATRE ETIQUETTE

If you must leave before intermission, do so quickly and quietly. Upon your return, an usher may ask you to remain at the back of the theatre until there is a suitable break in the performance.
