The Hon. Katharine Sweeney Hayden entered law school after working as a fiction editor and then as a teacher of college English. After graduating from Seton Hall Law School in 1975, she clerked for New Jersey Supreme Court Justice Robert L. Clifford, and then served as an Assistant United States Attorney for the District of New Jersey. Thereafter she entered private practice, eventually specializing in family law. She was elected by her peers as a Fellow of the American Academy of Matrimonial Attorneys and as a Fellow of the American Bar Foundation.

Judge Hayden was appointed to the New Jersey Superior Court in 1991, and served as a trial judge in the Family Part and Criminal Division. In the latter assignment, she established the Drug Court for Essex County, New Jersey, and served as its first judge. In 1997, she was appointed to the federal bench for the District of New Jersey, Newark vicinage. Since 2003, she has been a member of the adjunct faculty at Seton Hall Law School.

The Arabella Babb Mansfield Award is the highest award given by the National Association of Women Lawyers. The Award is given in recognition of professional achievement, positive influence and valuable contribution to women in the law and in society. The Award is named after the first American woman admitted to the State Bar in the United States and is usually given once a year. Recent past recipients include:
