January Chapter Meeting

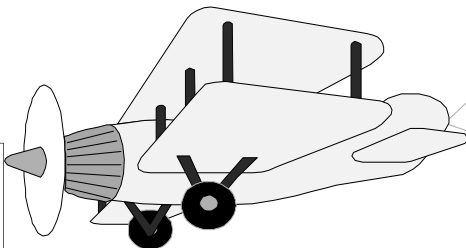

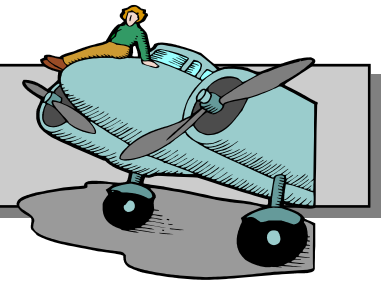
