GRADES K-5

June 30-July 3 (no camp July 4): Aquatic Adventures

There is nothing more fun than scooping into a pond and finding tadpoles, water tigers, and baby dragonflies (nymphs)! Explore different freshwater habitats including vernal pools, Indian Spring Pond, Mead Lake, and the Byram River to learn all about water and the creatures who live in it.

July 7-11: Creepy Crawlies

Grasshoppers, spiders, slugs, and centipedes are just some of the amazing invertebrates you will learn about during this skin crawling week of camp. Turn over logs, scoop into the pond, and push through the tall grass in search of the wiggling, slithering, sliding, and hopping animals of the underworld. Find out what they eat, where they hide, and what they do in order to survive in a world where they are food for hundreds of other animals.



July 14-18: Nature Scientists

Be a nature scientist during this week of outdoor investigation! What do you wonder about the forest, pond, or meadow? Build your scientific skills this week by asking questions, making predictions, recording observations, and drawing conclusions! Document your natural discoveries and create your very own nature journal.



July 21-25: Things With Wings

Discover the amazing diversity of creatures with wings! Learn how to identify birds and insects. Explore different flight patterns and learn how flying helps things with wings survive. Compare and contrast wing shapes and how they influence the daily lives of things with wings.

July 28-August 1: Aquatic Adventures

There is nothing more fun than scooping into a pond and finding tadpoles, water tigers, and baby dragonflies (nymphs)! Explore different freshwater habitats including vernal pools, Indian Spring Pond, Mead Lake, and the Byram River to learn all about water and the creatures that live in it.

August 4-8: Backwoods Explorers

Learn how to use a map and compass, build a fort, and "Leave No Trace" during this week of outdoor skill building. Take a journey into the lives of Native Americans and early pioneers to find out how they survived the everyday challenges of the natural world. This week will involve making maps, games, and crafts, and will end in a camp-wide fort-building game in the forest.

August 11-15: Twilight Investigations

Are you curious to find out where coyotes, snakes, and birds go when the sun goes down? Come join us for evenings filled with twilight travels as we journey into the forests and meadows in search of owls, bats, spiders, and fireflies. Learn how to attract moths, spot constellations, locate chirping crickets, and call to owls all before ending the week around a roaring campfire. *Grades K-3:* Mon-Fri 3pm-9pm / *Grades 4-5:* Mon-Wed 3pm-9pm, Thurs 3pm-Fri 9:30am (*overnight*)

July 7-11, July 14-18, July 21-25, July 28-August 1, August 4-8: Audubon Ecology Adventures

This exciting Audubon camp for teens combines exploration of the great outdoors with learning about the amazing biodiversity that is found in our local natural areas. Daily field trips to forests, rivers, and coastal areas will be guided by experienced Audubon Naturalists and will give young people an opportunity to learn about conserving the environment while having fun.

August 11-15: Evening Adventures

During this week, campers will explore local natural areas during twilight hours. Learn what happens when the sun goes down. End the week around a roaring campfire, a night hike, and an overnight on Audubon Greenwich grounds. Hours: Mon-Wed 3pm-9pm, Thurs at 3pm-Fri morning at 9:30am (*overnight*)
