

NOTICE TO ALL EMPLOYEES



POSTED PURSUANT TO A SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT APPROVED BY A REGIONAL DIRECTOR OF THE FEDERAL LABOR RELATIONS AUTHORITY

The Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Prisons, and the Council of Prison Locals C-33, American Federation of Government Employees have a collective bargaining relationship and are parties to a Master Collective Bargaining Agreement.

On November 8, 2007, the Agency and Union agreed to Electronic Searches of Bureau of Prisons Staff procedures. The procedures provide, in part, that:

All staff will be required to clear a metal detection device prior to gaining access to the secure confines of the institution. "Secure confines" for this purpose generally means entering the secured inner perimeter of the institution.

Electronic searches of all Bureau of Prisons staff will be conducted via walk-through or hand-held metal detectors by designated staff member(s). No inmates or inmate visitors will be allowed to remain in the area, or allowed to view screening procedures, when electronic searches of staff are being conducted.

The Agency has agreed to remind all Wardens to adhere to these procedures that were agreed to between the Agency and the Union.
