



- SAT Subject Tests
- 1. Generally, the most competitive colleges require Subject Tests
- 2. There are 20 different Subject tests, usually if a school requires them, then they will require 2. Tests are 1 hour in length. You may not do an SAT and Subject tests on the same day but may take up to 3 Subject Tests on one day.
- 3. Test dates and Registration are the same as the SAT.

### Standardized Testing (cont.)

- AP (Advanced Placement)
- 1. Not an admissions test
- 2. Used for college credit if score is high enough or for placement into a higher level course

# ACCUPLACER

- If you know you are going to attend Montgomery College then perhaps transfer to a four-year college, there is no need to take the SAT or the ACT.
- The ACCUPLACER is a college placement test that indicates whether or not you are "college ready."
- Northwood provides preparation to help students succeed on this test. College Test Prep, 2<sup>nd</sup> semester senior year

- <u>Safety Schools</u> Schools that possess the majority of the features a student desires and at which the probability of admission is highly likely
- <u>Realistic Schools</u> Schools that possess the significant features a student desires and at which the probability of admission is slightly better than even
- <u>Reach Schools</u> Schools that possess many of the features that a student desires, but admission is very, very competitive

<u>A Must</u> Students should want to attend all of the schools on their lists. Most Common Types of Admission Programs

- Regular Decision Answer by April 1
- Early Decision Answer usually by January 1
- Early Action Answer early, but not binding
- Priority Decision Maryland!!
- Rolling Admissions Apply early
