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## **Back to School!**

As I entered a local store I could not help but notice all the school supplies available for students to help them be prepared for school. I remember when my parents would buy me pens, pencils, notepads,etc., and how excited I would be with all my "new" stuff! This reminds me that no matter how long you have been involved in women's ministries, it is important to remember two things:

- 1. You are a student in God's school so be prepared to learn each day valuable lessons on character building.
- 2. School supplies eventually run out or wear off and need to be replaced. Keep your spiritually life "new" by spending time with God each day in reading and reflecting on His Word with seasons of prayer throughout the day.

Here are some other "supplies" I discovered for all of us to keep on hand:

#### 1. Box of Crayons.

Always be aware that your women's ministry is made up of all types of ladies. They come in every color, every age, and are all at different stages and crossroads in their lives so make activities and things to try to target their needs.

#### 2. Pens and Pencils.

Write lists and planning information out. Make a calendar of activities out for the year. Write out monthly and yearly goals for your women's ministry.

#### 3. Paper/Notebook.

Always carry a small notebook or have a pad of paper handy to write down ideas that may come to you at the least excepted moment. You never know when a great idea to enhance your women's ministry will pop up.

## 4. Books.

Remember to revolve everything in your women's ministry around the Bible (the best Book). Use God's Word as the Guide.

### 5. **Glue.**

Plan activities that will encourage fellowship between the ladies in your group. This will be the glue that binds your ladies together.

#### 6. Scissors.

Work on cutting out all unnecessary things in your women's ministry such as bad attitudes and gossip.

#### 7. Ruler.

Make sure you measure or evaluate the progress of your women's ministry from time to time. Has attendance to activities grown? Do your ladies fellowship more than before? Do the ladies in your group seem to be growing spiritually?

#### 8. Stapler.

Keep placing the staple of prayer into your women's ministry. It will keep things from falling apart.

## Let It Go!

To have an effective women's ministries it is necessary to let go of the negative and hold on to the positive. This is illustrated in a short devotion shared with me by a an encouraging friend titled "Let It Go". (You can view the devotion at: <a href="dianajaworski.wordpress.com">dianajaworski.wordpress.com</a>) This devotion describes our need of letting go of the "stone" we are holding on to so that we can move forward successfully in life. As women's ministry leaders, it is important to daily search ourselves to see what "stone" we are holding on to and ask God to help us to let it go so that we can be able to encourage those around us by teaching them how to let go of their own "stone". The following are a few presentation ideas that you can do at your next women's meeting in regards to letting go of the "stone" many are holding on to which impedes from serving God and others:

- Share the following parable and ask what lessons can be learned about the effects of not letting go: There is a tale about how certain hunters in Africa catch monkeys. A small jar is placed at the base of a tree with a peanut inside. The opening of the jar allows the monkey to place his hand in, but when he tries to withdraw it, he is unable to do so without letting go of the contents of the jar. Some monkeys will stay there with their hand in the jar until the hunter comes back to trap them. They are trapped because they are unwilling to let go of something they are doing which is working against them. And, it ultimately will lead to their demise.
- Pass out a small stone and have the participants hold on to their stone in one hand tightly. Let this stone represent something negative that is hard to let go of such as envy, anger, etc. Place a piece of candy on a table representing something positive that Jesus offers us such as peace, love, forgiveness, etc. The participants have the choice to let go of their stone in order to free their hand and thus be able to pick up the candy. Learn to realize that we do have a choice on what we desire to hold on to and know that God will give us the courage to make the correct choice.
- What Bible stories can you find that illustrates how holding on to something negative will have negative effects. (Example, Achan's Sin, Joshua 7) Share the lessons from these stories and how you can apply them to your own life.
- What Bible promises can you find that give you encouragement about God giving you the strength to make the correct choices.

Sabbath morning we did women of the Bible ask Why? And we had different ones dress as women of the Bible and ask them questions about their experiences and if they ever wondered Why? Things happened the way they did. It was really good and I could send you that if you would like to read it. My friend from Georgia wrote it and put together the outfits. Anyway, we were so blessed by the weekend and the help that you gave us in preparing for the weekend. Thank you again so much. I will attach a photo of the table center pieces. We did the game with the seeds in a jar and a game to get to know each other.
