Academic indicators show that Enochs High School is an excellent school with marks of high achievement. Enochs High School's 2009 Academic Performance Index score of 761 exceeded the five point growth goal. Enochs has shown steady growth on the API over the past three years. The 761 is a six point growth over last year. EHS met 17 of 18 Adequate Yearly Progress criteria. Enochs High School students consistently scored above the District and state averages in the number of students scoring advanced and proficient on the 2009 STAR exams. Enochs High School has the highest California High School Exit Exam passing rate of any school in our area with 85% in math and 82% in ELA. Research indicates that regular school attendance is related to higher achievement, and Enochs attendance rate of just under 95% could certainly be considered a contributing factor to student achievement at Enochs High School.

There is a strong academic focus at Enochs High School. Principal, Michael Coats' theme for the year is "Refreshed." The focus is that Enochs High School is continuing to provide an outstanding learning opportunity for all students with rejuvenated methods and revitalized strategies. The instructional focus is on delivering rigorous and relevant instruction with high expectations for all students using effective evidence-based teaching practices. This aligns with the Modesto City School's Strategic Plan goal: A diploma in every hand; a rewarding career in every future; ... a contributing member of our global society.

As the school has grown in enrollment, there has been an increase in the number of college preparatory course offerings. There has also been a consistent development of Advanced Placement courses. Currently twelve advanced placement courses are taught at Enochs High School with 559 students enrolled in the AP classes. In the spring of 2009 Enochs High School students took 335 Advanced Placement exams.

This focus at Enochs High School represents our renewed commitment to educational achievement for every student. We trust that your son or daughter has a fantastic school year with academic success, personal growth, and enjoyment as they get involved in the many activities and events available at Enochs High School.

ATTENDANCE OFFICE GUIDELINES

- 1. Call the Attendance Office (209) 550-3405 to clear absences within seven (7) school days or the absence will be considered "unexcused." (Voicemail is available 24 hours.)
- 2. Please make every effort to schedule appointments (medical, dental, etc.) *after* school hours to avoid classroom interruption.
- 3. Enochs High School is a closed campus. Parents/guardians must come to the Attendance Office to sign out their student, or send a <u>signed</u> note with the student which should be given to the Attendance Office staff in the morning before school starts. Failure to follow this procedure will result in a <u>Truancy</u>.
- 4. Three (3) "unexcused" absences = $\underline{\mathbf{U}}$ nsatisfactory Citizenship
- 5. Five (5) "unexcused" tardies = $\underline{\mathbf{U}}$ nsatisfactory Citizenship
- 6. Unsatisfactory citizenship could result in work permits being revoked, ineligibility for sports and other extra-curricular activities.

FORENSIC BIOTECH PROGRAM UPDATE

Last June, students from the Enochs High Forensic Biotech program ended another great year. Thirty-one students comprised the first graduating class. Of these, many were accepted to a variety of colleges and universities including UC Davis, UOP, Stanislaus State University, UC Merced, San Jose State and UC Santa Barbara. An excellent testament to the high regard our program is held in, was shown in an e-mail from **Jovanny Hernandez**, who said that he was personally welcomed by the director of biotechnology at UC Davis, **Dr. Judy Kjelstrom** during his first days there. **Dr. Kjelstrom** is a strong supporter of the Enochs Forensic Biotech program since the beginning, and was eager the help **Jovanny** get off to a good start.

During the summer, Enochs students were invited by the director of the National Ag Science Center and Enochs parent **Michelle Laverty** to demonstrate techniques they had learned here at school at the California State Fair at Cal Expo. Hundreds of fair visitors enjoyed the biotech skills the students displayed, and one of the team's members, **Bonnie Whipple**, has been offered a summer internship at a local firm.

This year's program numbers more than 420 students taught by three teachers in 14 sections including years 1-4 and forensic anatomy/physiology. Students are now learning advanced lab techniques that they will take with them to colleges and universities. Program teacher **Carol Schutt**, began a year four research class designed to further enhance the students' skills for college, as well as their success. One of the points that **Jovanny** made in his e-mail was that professors were looking for students who had had that kind of training, and that it would improve the college applications of those who had taken it. As **Mrs.Schutt** is a former NASA research associate, she teaches an approach to science that is authentic and in demand.

Recently, Enochs Forensic Biotech students hosted a Forensic Day supported by the Nasco Company, (a national science supply company with a local office). Luis Neri, Rafael Arroyo, Drew Davis, Miraflor Batomalgue, Rebecca Lamar, Aaron Wall, Kenneth Laverty, Brian Reinhart, and Alexa Adams. During their free time on a Saturday, these dedicated learners set up complex crime scenes and sophisticated forensic tests designed to teach teachers how to include crime scene dynamics into their lessons and engage students.

This year's classes are filled with the most diverse group of highly intelligent students we have ever had. The staff is looking forward to seeing the accomplishments they will bring back to Enochs!

Enochs Student Balances Many Responsibilies

For three years, **Alyssa Perez** has exemplified the best of Enochs spirit. She has shown commitment to goals, a drive to succeed, and the abilities to attain her objectives. On July 1st, Alyssa took first place in FFA horse advanced showmanship. She went on to compete in Master Showmanship on August 6th where she placed 7th. This was quite an accomplishment as she competed against other students with more experience and this was her first attempt!
