## II. DESCRIPTIONS OF FORMS

Brief descriptions of the forms contained in your U.S. Legal Forms™ Personal Planning Package are found below.

Affidavit for Collection of Personal Property of Decedent - This Affidavit form is for a person to complete stating the heirs of a deceased person. It is commonly used to establish ownership of personal property. It may be recorded in official land records, if necessary. Example of use: Person A dies without a Will, leaves a son and no estate is opened. When the son sells the land, the son obtains this affidavit to record with the deed. The person executing the affidavit should normally not be an heir of the deceased, or other person interested in the estate.

General Power of Attorney Effective Immediately -This General Power of Attorney is a general power of attorney which is effective IMMEDIATELY. You can use this form to appoint an attorney-in-fact (agent) to make decisions regarding property, financial, banking, management, business and other matters for you. The powers granted to an Agent in this Power of Attorney are very broad, but this Power of Attorney does NOT provide for health care services. This form complies with all applicable state statutory laws.

Revocation of General Power of Attorney -This is a Revocation of the General Power of Attorney which allow you to appoint an attorney-in-fact (agent) to make decisions regarding property, financial, management, banking, business and other matters for you. Specific reference is made to the previously executed power of attorney and the date of its execution.

Statutory Advance Health Care Directive -This statutory advance health care directive has been enacted by Alaska Acts - Chapter 83 of 2004 and contains five parts relating to: Durable Power of Attorney for Health Care Decisions, Instructions for Health Care, Anatomical Gift at Death, Mental Health Treatment, and Primary Physician Designation.

Personal Planning Information and Document Inventory Worksheets - A Legal Life Document -This form enables you to document matters relevant to your life and personal planning such as the location of your important legal documents, relatives names, contact information, medical information, financial asset inventory and more.

It is also helpful to be able to see the location of the form fields. Go to the View menu, click on Toolbars, and then select Forms. This will open the Forms toolbar. Look for the button on the Forms toolbar that resembles a shaded letter "a". Click this button and the form fields will be visible.

By clicking on the appropriate form field, you will be able to enter the needed information. In some instances, the form field and the line will disappear after information is entered. In other cases, it will not. The form was created to function in this manner.
